CHS Wins 2 in Baseball, Takes Second in Golf Meet

A&M Consolidated's Tigers ran their district record to two wins and no losses yesterday by downing Navasota's Rattlers 5-2 at Tiger Field. Season record for CHS is now 6-5.

Edgar Feldman pitched five innings of three-hit ball to take the win, his fourth of the season against two losses, with Bobby Potts finishing the last two frames, giving up but two safe blows.

CHS got two runs in the second inning, with the big blows being Feldman's double and a single by George Carroll. Navasota broke

into the scoring column in the fourth with one run on a walk and two errors. The Tigers sewed up the game in the fifth with three runs on three hits—singles by Steadman Davis, Manuel Garcia and Mike McGuire.

Consolidated had 5 runs, 5 hits and 2 errors; Navasota, 2, 5 and 4. Battery for CHS was Feldman, (See CONSOLIDATED, Page 4)

Okamoto Places In NCAA Meet

Tetsuo Okamoto, sophomore swimmer from A&M, placed in two events in the NCAA finals held last weekend at New Haven, Conn. Okamoto, who was accompanied to the meet by A&M swimming coach Art Adamson, was the only Aggie swimmer entered, as Ohio State splashed to win.

The Aggie swimmer placed third in his specialty, the 1,500-meter freestyle, and sixth in the 440-yard freestyle. Dick Breen, Cortland State Teachers College, set a new world's record in the 1,500 meters, beating the old mark of 18:19 in swimming the distance in 18:05:19.

Okamoto is only the second Aggie ever to score points in the national meet. Danny Green took third in the 1,500 meter freestyle and 440-yard freestyle in 1946.

Only one other Southwest Conference swimming team scored points in the meet. SMU's Pedro Gavin won third in the 100- and 200-yard backstroke, and Ronnie Smith of SMU took sixth in high-board diving.

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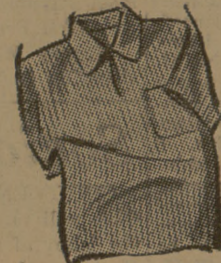
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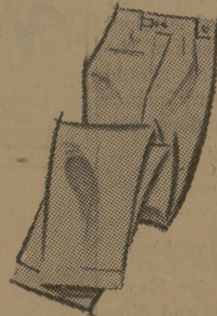
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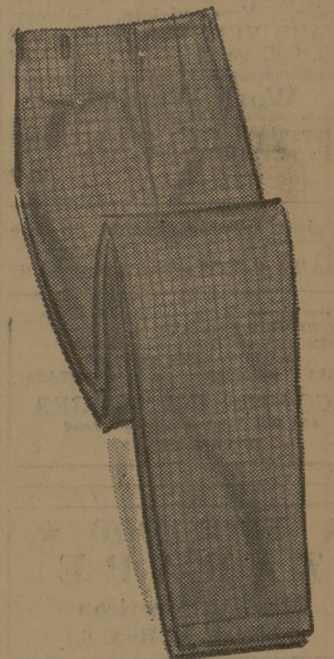
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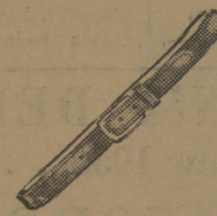
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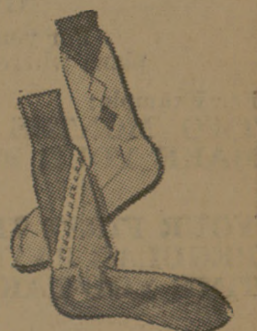
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
