Last night's class dealt with skin care and make up application. Each girl enrolled was checked individually and then shown the proper procedure for caring for the skin and applying makeup.

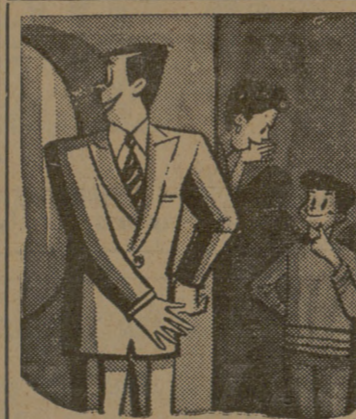
The second lesson will be devoted to the following: learning to walk, standing properly and correct posture. Those present at the second lesson who were also enrolled last night, will be checked on their make up application.

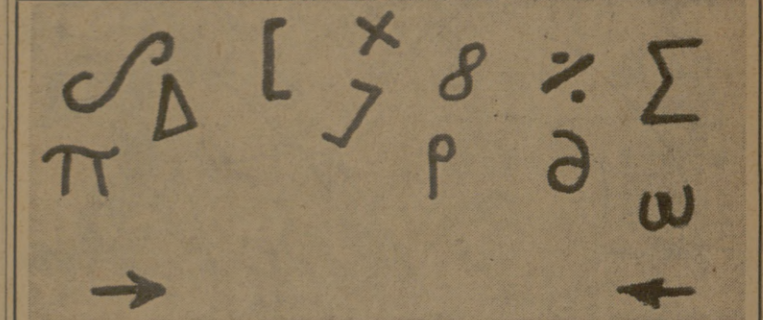

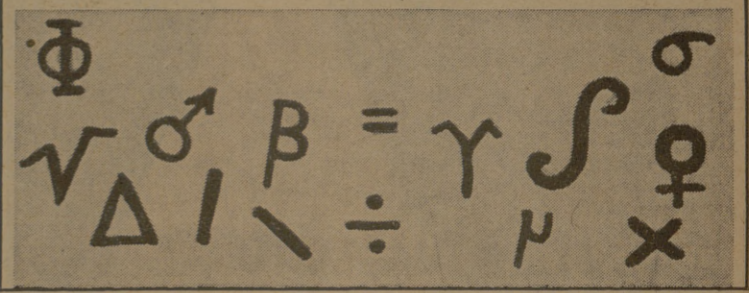
