An article in the April edition of McCall's magazine asserts that cheaters outnumber non-cheaters today in most United States colleges and high schools.

"Cheating is a national problem, not confined to any one area of the country, any one type of neighborhood, anyone

type of school," the article reports.

"Honor systems—used in ten per cent of the nation's colleges and less than one per cent of its high schools—are not proof against it," the magazine explains, "as witness the fact that 93 cadets, the cream of the football squad, were caught cheating at West Point a few years ago, and 109 students were caught at the University of Florida.

The magazine placed the blame on students, parents and teachers alike, but placed special emphasis on adults who cut ethical corners, thereby setting a bad example for their

We'll have to agree with McCall's about the blame for cheating—who else is left? But any person who is in college should be some sort of an adult already.






