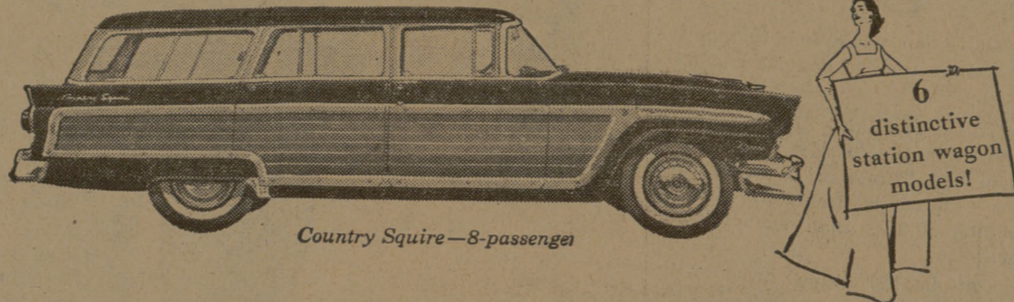
Rev. Robert Monk, A&M Wesley director, has chosen "How This Purpose is Developed" and "What
