REGALIA FOR BACCALAUREATE SERMON AND COMMENCEMENT EXERCISES

All civilian students who are candidates for the degree of Doctor of Veterinary Medicine will wear the doctor's cap, gown and hood appropriate to that degree. (Hoods will not be worn at the Baccalaureate Sermon.) Ph.D. candidates are also required to order hoods and leave them with the Registrar no later than 1:00 p.m., Tuesday, May 15. The Ph.D. hoods will not be worn in the procession since all such candidates will be hooded on the stage. Candidates for the Master's and Professional degrees will wear the Master's cap and gown. Candidates for the Bachelor's degree will wear the bachelor's cap and gown. All military personnel, or military students who are candidates for any of the above degrees, will wear the appropriate uniform.

Rental of caps and gowns may be arranged with the College Exchange Store. Orders may be placed until noon, Saturday, May 12, but it is desirable to place them as early as possible. The rental is as follows: Doctor's cap and gown \$3.90; Master's cap and gown \$3.00; Bachelor's cap and gown \$3.30. The rental for hoods is the same as that for caps and gowns. C. E. Twenty-five BSU Aggies attended the conference to make plans for the coming year and to obtain ideas for improving BSU program.



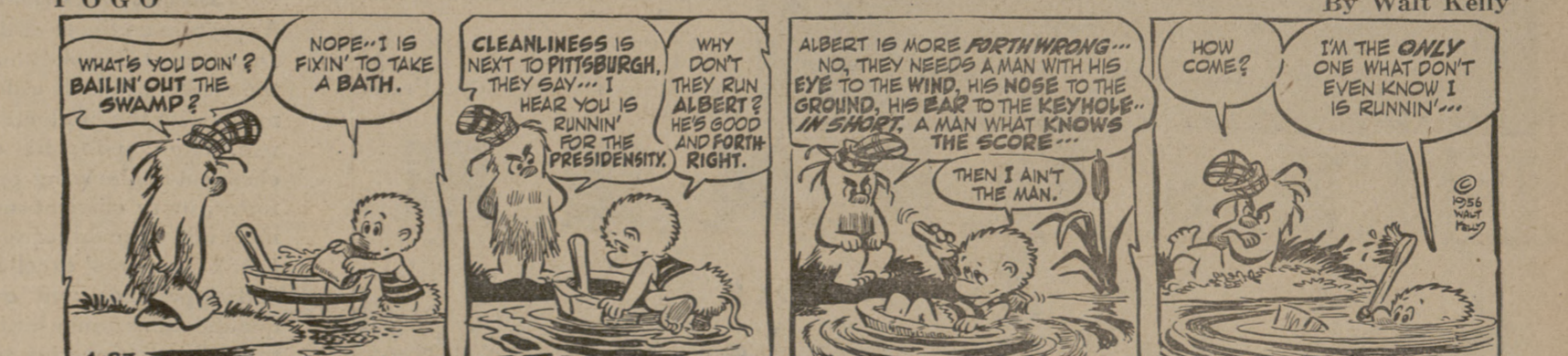
