Aggies, Mustangs Open Series at Dallas Today

A&M returns to the scene of its 1955 glory today in the first of two weekend meetings with SMU's strong Mustangs at Armstrong Field in Dallas.

The 3 p.m. game will be broadcast over WTAW. Sportscaster Ken George will bring a play-by-play description of both games. Sophomore Toby Newton will probably get the starting nod from Coach Beau Bell today, with junior righthander Dick Munday taking the hill tomorrow. Newton, a lefty, shutout the Mustangs in the conference opener at College Station, 1-0, on a dazzling three-hitter. Malcolm Shaw, ace lefthander for the Ponies, will probably op-

pose Newton today. Shaw was a victim of the opening day loss to the Aggies, although pitching a two-hitter. The Aggies have now beaten the Mustangs four straight times over the past two seasons by a single run.

Southern Methodist is currently tied with Baylor for second place in conference standings. Both have 5-3 records. Last week the Ponies lost to Baylor, 1-5, while A&M split a two-game series with Texas at Austin. A&M is fourth in the SWC.

The Aggies won the league crown on this same Armstrong Field last year in one of the great rallies of conference history. Trailing 1-3 through eight innings, the Cadets pushed across two runs in the top of the ninth and one in the 11th to win the game and the title. Among the heroes of last year's game at Dallas were pitchers Tex Vanzura and Dick Munday and outfielder John Stockton. Munday

and Stockton are back again this season.

DALLAS—Both Texas Tech and University of Houston will be submitted for membership when the Southwest Conference holds its spring meeting at Fayetteville May 11-12.

Texas A&M's probation for violating the recruiting rules also will be re-examined with a view toward lifting the ban.

GRAND RAPIDS, Mich.—The Grand Rapids Press said today heavyweight champion Rocky Marciano has abandoned retirement plans and is lining up a September title bout in the East.

Marciano was not available for comment.

CHICAGO—Ohio State University, winner of the Big 10 football championship for the last two years, was put on probation for one year by the Western Confer-

ence today for giving excessive financial assistance to football players.

The principal penalty in the disciplinary action is that Ohio State will not be permitted to represent the Big 10 in the Rose Bowl football game next New Year's Day if the team should qualify by winning the conference title.

MELBOURNE—Jamaica's acceptance of the Olympic invitation brought to 72 today the number of countries to be represented in the games Nov. 22-Dec. 8. The previous record was 69 countries at the Helsinki Games four years ago.

CLEVELAND—If Vic Wertz can stay within 100 points of his .429 pace with Cleveland, he'll be the Comeback of the Year story in all sports. The first baseman was felled by polio last summer and remained a doubtful factor through spring training.

CHS, Cardinals Tangle at 4 p.m. On Tiger Field

Deep in the clutches of a four-game losing streak, A&M Consolidated's baseball Tigers put their hopes on their frosh battery here today as they entertain the Columbus Cardinals at 4 p.m. on Tiger field.

Freshman Edgar Feldman will open on the mound for the Tigers and will be throwing to frosh Pete Rodriguez behind the plate. Rodriguez, regular right fielder, has replaced Steadman Davis who has a ruptured blood vessel in his arm. The Cardinals mauled Consolidated in their first-round district game, 10-4.

The remainder of the Tigers starting nine are Alton Arnold at first base; David McNeely at the second sack; George Carroll on the hot corner and Bill Kavanaugh at shortstop.

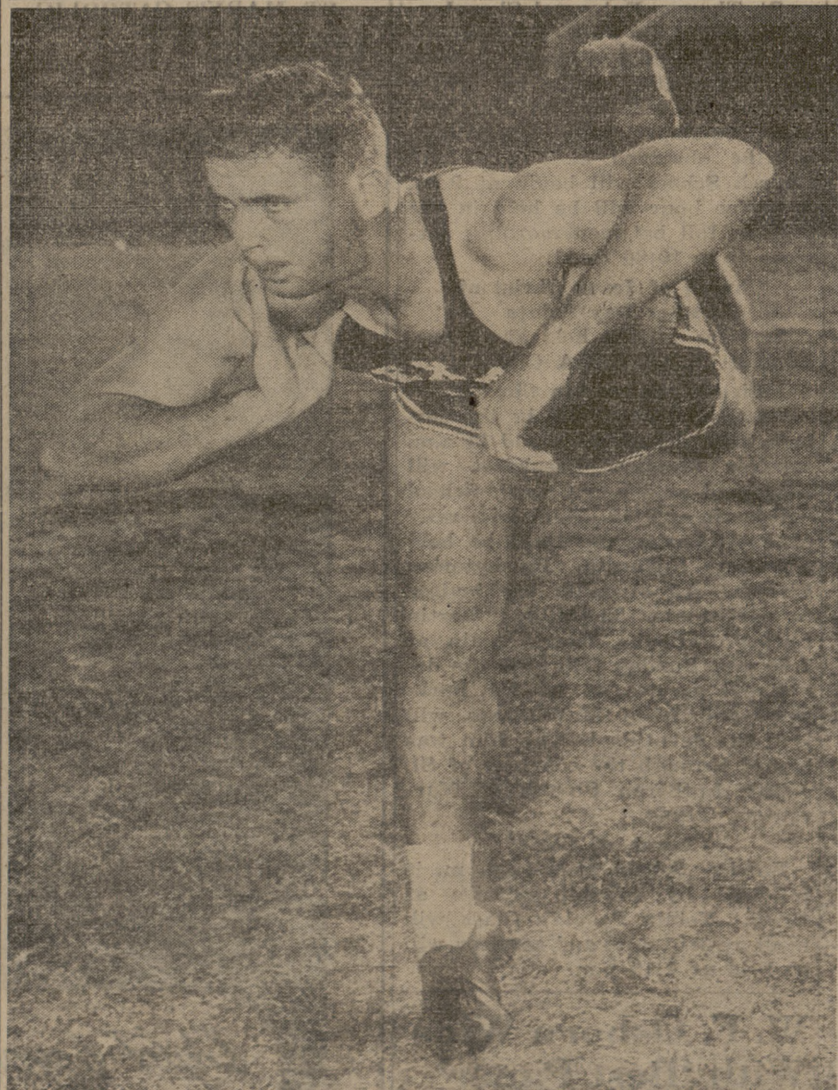
Bill Hite, Mike McGuire and Bobby Potts will patrol the outfield.
