Florida Prisoners Riot; 11 Wounded

RAIFORD, Fla., (AP)—A prisoner was shot to death and 11 wounded when convicts at the Florida State Prison rioted yesterday morning.

They used the excuse of complaints about the food—especially beans every day for lunch, Warden DeWitt Sinclair said last night after questioning ringleaders.

"Actually that wasn't the trouble, the warden said. "There were just a few hotheaded boys who wanted to start something and they had to find some excuse." The demonstration started among 225 of the 2,539 prisoners. Sinclair said between 20 and 30 were ringleaders and they were locked up in maximum security.

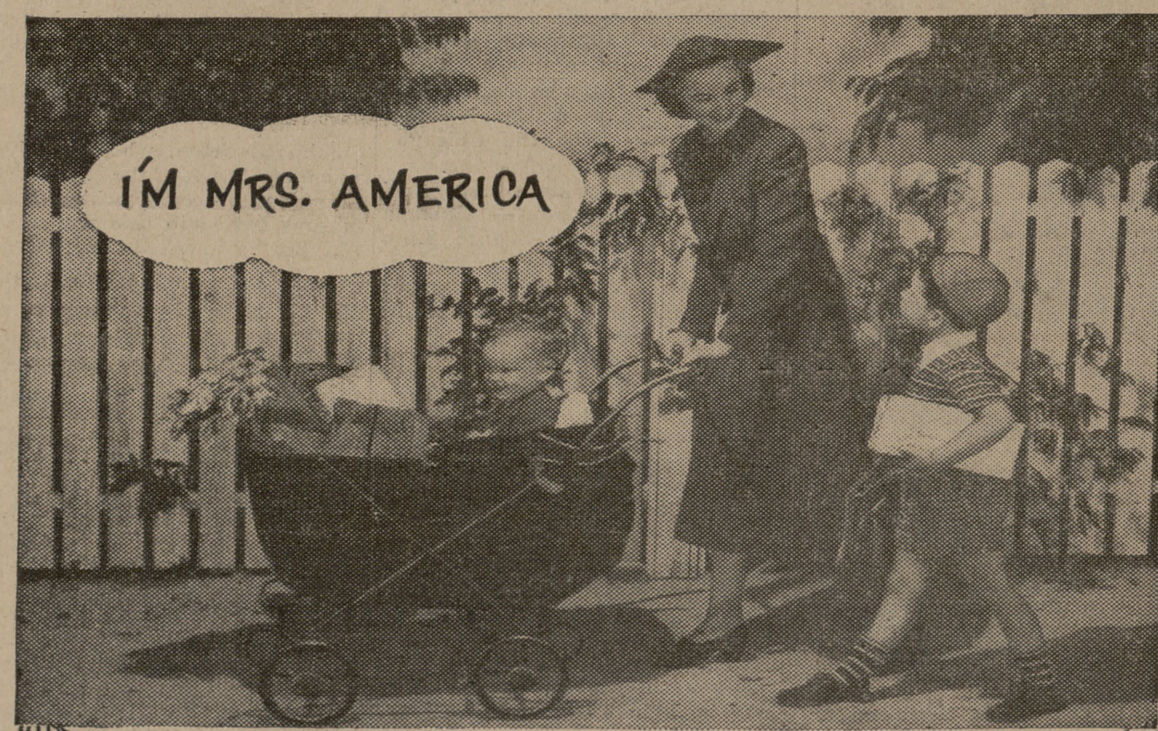
