Within the past month, Sime has broken the world records for the 220-yard dash with a 20.1 seconds clocking, the 220-yard low hurdles with 22.2 and then equalled the listed 100 and 220-yard records of 9.3 and 20.2 on the same day.

SIME ISN'T THE only college athlete to flash from obscurity within the past year. California's Leamon King, another sophomore, also has equalled the world 100yard record this spring. 


