Photography New Course Next Fall

A new course in photography will be added to the Journalism Department next fall, according to D. D. Burchard head of the department.

The new course, Journalism 315, will be taught by Wesley Calvert, assistant professor of journalism. It will replace Physics 315 which, prior to this time, has been the only photography course offered at A&M.

A laboratory for the course will be located in the first floor of the Civil Engineering Building where the entire Journalism Department will be housed sometime early in 1937.

"We are planning new equipment and modern laboratory facilities that will compare favorably with any laboratory in the country," claims Burchard.
