Board Awards Contracts

Construction contracts totaling \$1,151,781.59 were awarded by the Board of Directors of the A&M System at their meeting Saturday morning.

More than half of the total construction will be on the campus at A&M, the rest spread over the System.

Revenue bond issues, of which \$500,000 is for use at College Station, totalled \$920,000. The \$520,000 at A&M will be used for the Power Plant; \$420,000 went for use at Arlington State College at Arlington.

One construction contract was increased by \$9,270, two totalling \$49,902 were confirmed and the Chancellor was authorized to award a contract for \$63,541, pending the signing of an agreement.

Contracts awarded for work at A&M included one to W. E. Kutzschbach Company, Bryan, for construction of underground electric lines and an east-side substation on a bid of \$158,876; to Meyer Blanke Company, St. Louis, Mo. for major items of equipment at the creamery, \$40,252.59; to Henry Vogt Co., Louisville, Ky., for steam generator at the power plant, \$175,488; to DeLaval Steam Turbine Co., Trenton, N. J. for 5,000-kilowatt generator, \$292,760; Condenser Service and Engineering Co., Hoboken, N. J., for 6,750 square foot condenser, \$53,715.

Contracts awarded since the last board meeting to Wood-Leppard Air Conditioning Co., Houston, for air-conditioning the basement of the college administration building, a lecture room at Nagle Hall and alternations at the Memorial Student Center, \$29,310, was confirmed.

The Chancellor was authorized, upon completion of a pending agreement with the United States Department of Agriculture, to award a contract for air-conditioning two floors of the USDA building to Way Engineering Co., of Houston, on a bid of \$63,541.

Kutzschbach of Bryan was awarded a contract for constructing a steam tunnel extension at Prairie View on a bid of \$15,545; Childs Construction Co., Fort Worth, contract for building a new women's dormitory at Arlington, \$404,250; Haws and Garrett, Fort Worth, new acoustical ceiling for the auditorium at Tarleton State College, \$10,895. Contract awarded Owens and Burkett Co., Houston, for repairs at Prairie View, \$20,592, was confirmed and a contract of Owens and Burkett for repairs to Woodruff Hall at Prairie View was increased by \$9,270.

Appropriations by the board at Saturdays' meeting totalled \$1,296,070.31. This includes construction for which contracts were awarded, not covered by previous appropriations, and including \$300,000 for maintenance, repairs and alteration of existing buildings at A&M during the coming year. This included \$21,000 for new classroom equipment and moving of Civil Engineering Department to new quarters; \$50,000 for remodeling Nagle Hall for use of the School of Arts and Sciences; \$69,000 for greenhouse construction for Agronomy, Plant Physiology and Pathology; \$9,700 for the current year and \$57,300 for next year for work in Oceanography Department.

Power plant revenue bonds for A&M in the amount of \$500,000 were sold jointly to Rotan, Mosle Co., Houston; Underwood and Neuhaus, Houston and Austin; Hart and Parvin, Houston. This joint bid was the lowest for a weighted average annual interest rate of 3.249004 percent. Dormitory revenue bonds for Arlington State College were sold jointly to First Southwest Co., Dallas; Rauscher, Pierce and Co. Inc., Dallas; and M. E. Allison and Co., San Antonio. Their weighted average annual interest rate was 4.12441 percent.

Contracts for printing the bonds went to the Steck Co., Austin, on a bid of \$184 for the A&M bonds; Arlington bond printing went to the Helms Printing Co. Inc., Dallas for \$200.
