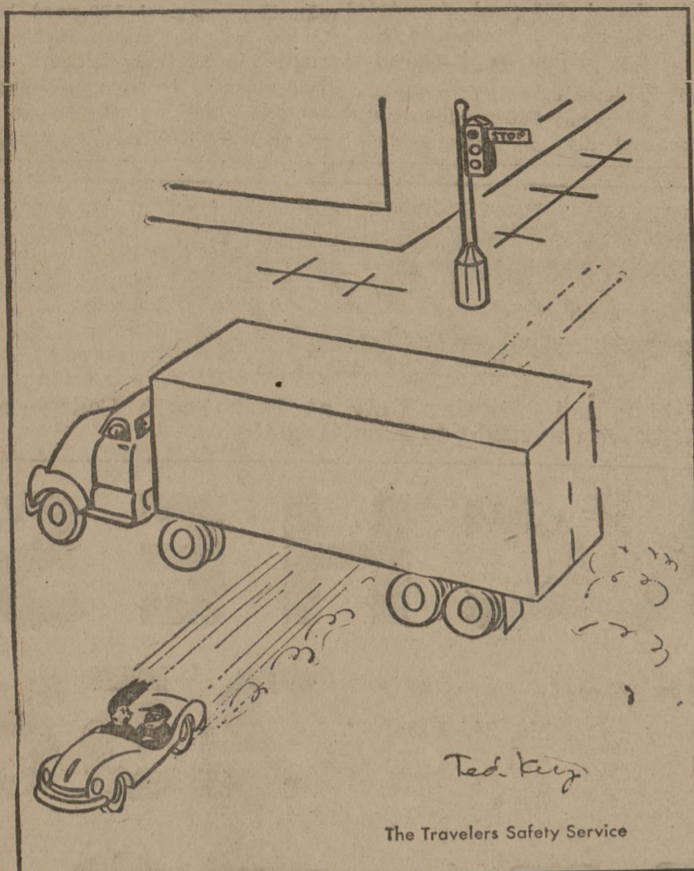
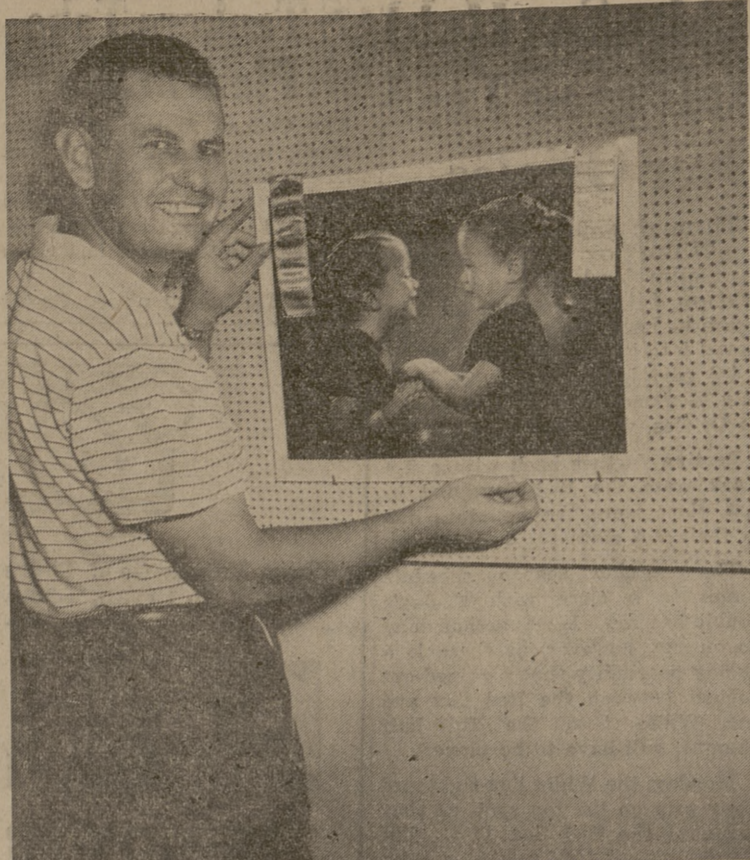


Fatal Fallacies by Ted Key
