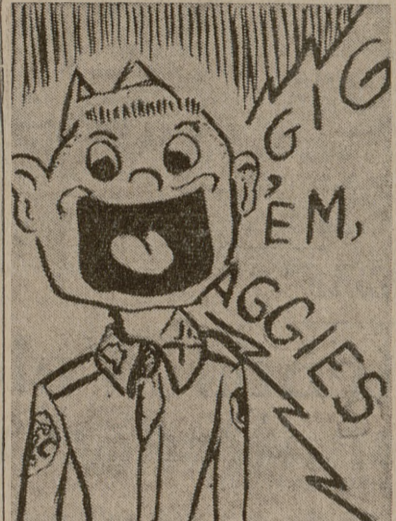
streets that have streetcar tracks),

After leaving the party in the wee hours, you have two choices. First, you may drive back to col- lege right away so you can meet breakfast formation Sunday



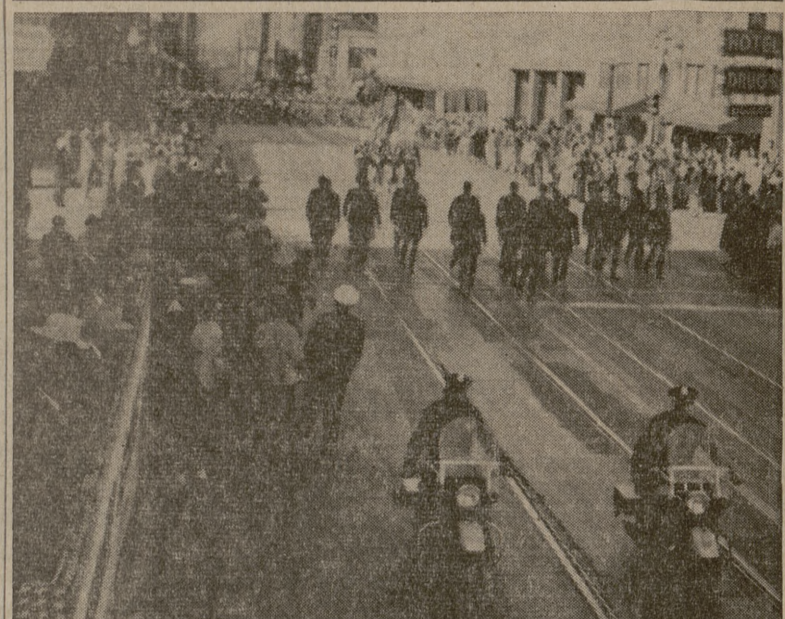
