



> Aggies Strong Coach Paul Bryant has 20 lettermen back from last season's second-place Aggies and the team is equipped with strong running, adept passing and plenty of reserve strength. The element of surprise will be gone, however. The Aggies weren't expected to do much last season and the race was almost over before anybody realized they were doing it. Baylor comes up with something it hasn't had in the past five years ample reserve strength. It also has three fine quarterbacks. The squad seeps with experience and power and this time the Golden Bears can start the season with the fellow they depended upon for two years, only to have to play halfway through without him-Doyle Traylor. Traylor, who missed a lot of time because of broken bones, is sound and rugged.
