BUTTER HORN ROLLS

1 cake Fleischmann Yeast
1/2 cup sugar
1 cup sweet milk (lukewarm)
2 t. salt

3/4 cup shortening
3 eggs
4 cups flour (if necessary add enough for soft dough)

Stir yeast with 1 T. sugar until liquid. Add remaining sugar and beaten eggs. Add other ingredients until smooth. Put into greased crock at night. Next morning work down before breakfast and let rise 2 hours. Divide dough into half and roll out round, like pie crust but not quite so thin. Cut 16 pie shaped pieces, spread with melted butter. Roll each piece, place in greased pan. Let rise 30 minutes. Bake 15-20 minutes at 375 degrees.

FILLED NOODLES

Noodles:
2 eggs
1/2 t. baking powder

enough flour for stiff dough
2 T. water

Roll and cut 4 by 4 squares. Makes 12 to 14.

Filling:

3/4 lb. ground meat
1 small onion fried in

salt
pepper

2 T. shortening
Place filling on squares after mixing ingredients. Fold and pinch edges together. Drop into sauce.

Sauce:

4 cups water
1 T. butter

1-No. 2 can tomatoes
1/2 t. salt

Boil 15 or 20 minutes with filled noodles. Place on platter and serve with sauce.

FRUIT SALAD

small can sliced pineapples
3 apples
3 bananas

3 oranges
3/4 cup pecans

Dressing for salad is made by juice of pineapple. Add:

3 T. lemon juice
4 T. sugar

2 beaten eggs
2 T. butter

Mix ingredients with pineapple juice, stir and cook until dressing thickens. Cool and pour over combined fruits.

STUFFED POTATOES

1/2 lb. pork
1/2 lb. ground meat

4 medium size potatoes

Half potatoes, scoop out centers, forming a shell. Form meat patties and press firmly into potatoes. Bake in slow oven, (300 degrees) for about 45 minutes. Make white gravy from drippings, pour over potatoes. Serves 4 persons.
