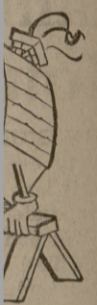

CHS Loses Third Straight To Unbeaten Eagles, 39-0

The unscored-on Smiley Eagles capitalized on superior depth and a 24-pound weight advantage Friday night to rout CHS's Tigers 39-0.

Friday's game marked the second consecutive game the Tigers have been shutout, being trounced 46-0 by Rockdale, another unscored on eleven, last week. CHS now stands at 1-3 for the season, all non-district tilts.

Coach Horace Shaffer's small squad, both in numbers and pounds, battled gamely and trailed only 13-0 at halftime. Smiley's manpower finally wore the Tigers down in the last half when the

Eagles romped for four touchdowns.

The Tigers, aided by an Eagle penalty, made their deepest penetration of the night into Smiley territory early in the second stanza. CHS marched to the 23 before Smiley's Wayne Smith intercepted one of Alton Arnold's aeriels and raced 91 yards for an apparent TD. His brilliant scamper was called back, however, due to a clipping charge.

Bill Kavanaugh, crushing CHS fullback, turned in a sparkling showing on both offense and defense. Kavanaugh chalked up all of CHS's pass interceptions, snagging two opposing aeriels.
