

Aggies Work on Goal Line Offense For Horned Frogs--Pardee Will Play

Jack Pardee, A&M's bruising fullback, will play against TCU Saturday.

"I think Pardee will be ready," said Coach Paul (Bear) Bryant. "According to the trainer he'll be all right. No rough stuff for

Jack this week, though, he'll just work on plays with no contact."

Pardee, who was injured early in the Houston game and was in bandages this week, was one of Bryant's biggest worries preceding Saturday's invasion of the nation's fourth-ranked team, the

Horned Frogs. Bryant's problems are now cut down to finding someone to play end and getting his team working together.

"We flubbed both our defensive and offensive signals like fifth graders," glared Bryant after Wednesday's workout. "I don't know what they're thinking about."

After failing to score in the final 33 seconds from the one against Houston, the Aggies worked hard on an offensive goal-line scrimmage against the freshmen.

"We moved the ball over the goal line pretty well," said the head coach.

With Right end Bobby Drake Keith out for the season with a fractured jaw, Philadelphia's John Tracey moves into the right wing position. Don Smith stands behind Tracey, but both are sophomores. On the left, Bobby Marks holds down the starting post with Bebes Stallings next. Third-teamer Lloyd Wasserman broke his hand Tuesday and probably will be out for the remainder of the season.

TCU ARRIVES FRIDAY in time to work out on Kyle Field for the 52nd meeting of the two rivals. The Aggies put a 19-16 defeat on the Frogs in Fort Worth last year, the only loss suffered by Abe Martin's perfect Purple in regular season play. The series began back in 1897 with the Aggies winning 27, the Toads 19 and five games tied since.

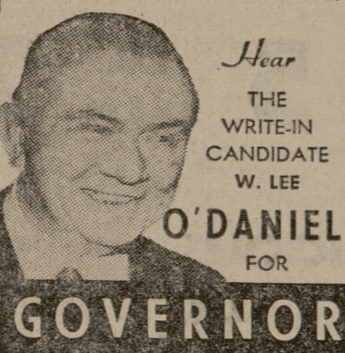

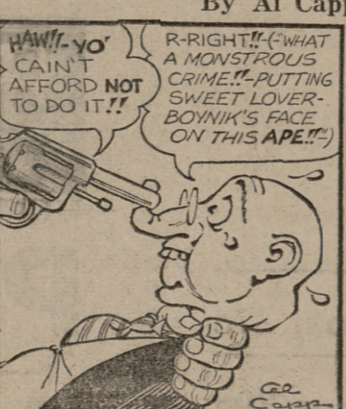

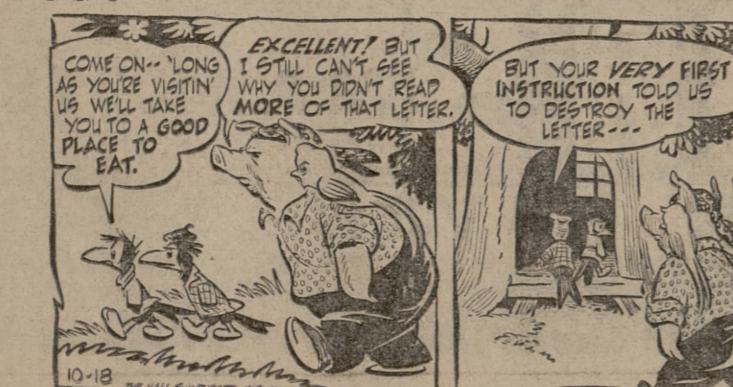
