OKLAHOMA CITY—(A)— A pretty 17-year-old girl, who was married in her hospital bed to her sweetheart Wednesday, was told yesterday she must lose her right leg because of a malignant cancer.


At first, Cherrie Lee Thompson laughed and told the doctor he was kidding her. She didn't understand what malignancy meant.

After the doctor explained, she turned to her groom of a day, Laroy Jay, 21, and said, "New see what kind of a girl you married," and began to cry.


