Rules Set For R And F Club Turkey Shoot

Over one hundred turkeys will be given away at the Range and Forestry Club Turkey Shoot, Friday, Nov. 9, according to Dean Bibles, chairman of the ticket sales committee.

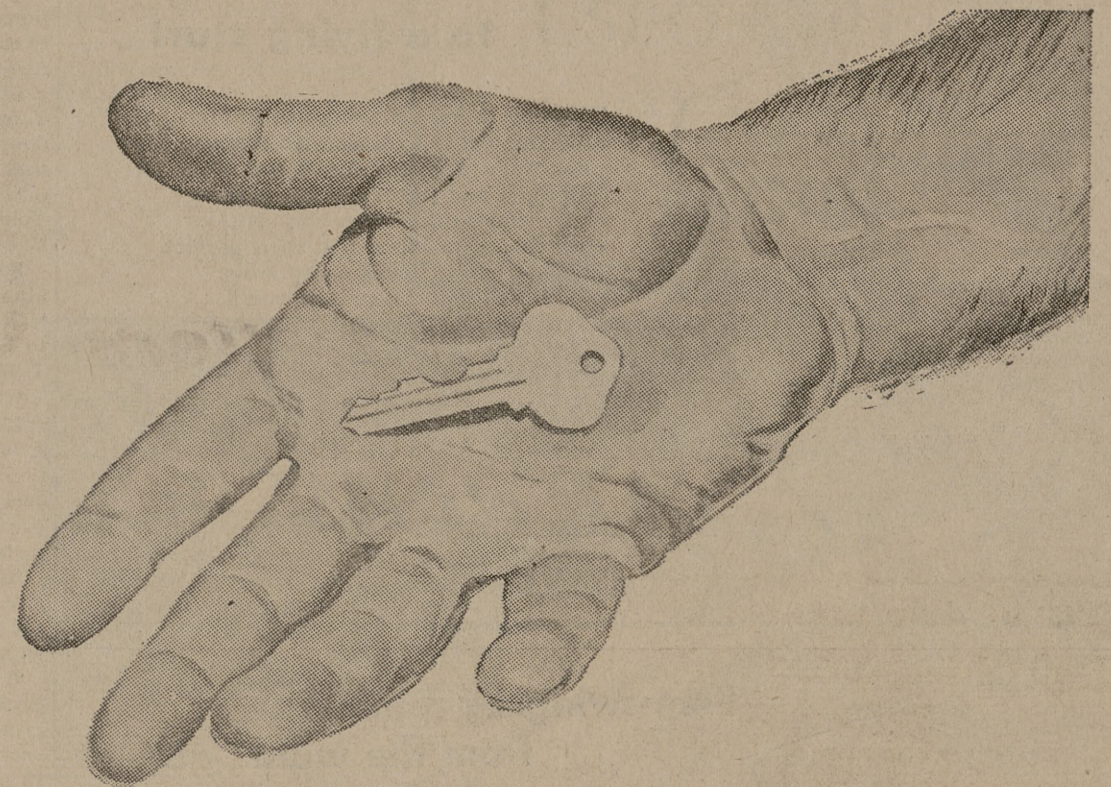
Orville Lindsey, chairman of the rules committee said that the rules of the Turkey shoot will be as follows:

- Ten contestants will compete for one turkey and the best score wins the turkey.
 - Two shots will be fired per person and the person firing the two closest shots wins regardless of the location of the target.
 - More than two shots on one target disqualifies the individual.
 - All Contestants will fire from the standing position.
 - No personal guns will be allowed.
 - Targets will be at a distance of 50 feet.
 - Safety rules of the range must be observed at all times. Violators will be removed from the range without refund of ticket price.
 - Safety instructions will be given to each group of ten. The supervisor of each group must be obeyed at all times. This is for the safety of all concerned.
 - A person may win only two turkeys.
- Tickets are being sold by all members of the club. They can also be obtained at Student Activities Office.
