Aggies Still Fifth

Vols Replace OU As No. 1 in Nation

The Tennessee Volunteers are the No. 1 football team in the latest Associated Press poll, edging out Oklahoma by two points in the closest vote of the season.

Although Oklahoma earned 92 first place votes among the 159 ballots from sports writers and sportscasters and Tennessee received 58 first, the point total gave the Vols the nod.

Point totals are figured on the basis of 10 for first, nine for second and so on down to one point for a tenth place vote. On that system, Tennessee rolled up 1,446 points to Oklahoma's 1,444 points. Michigan State in third place had 993 points.

Despite Oklahoma's 44-0 romp over Iowa State for its 37th straight victory, Tennessee drew more attention from the voters by its 6-0 victory over Georgia Tech in the Atlanta struggle of the unbeaten.

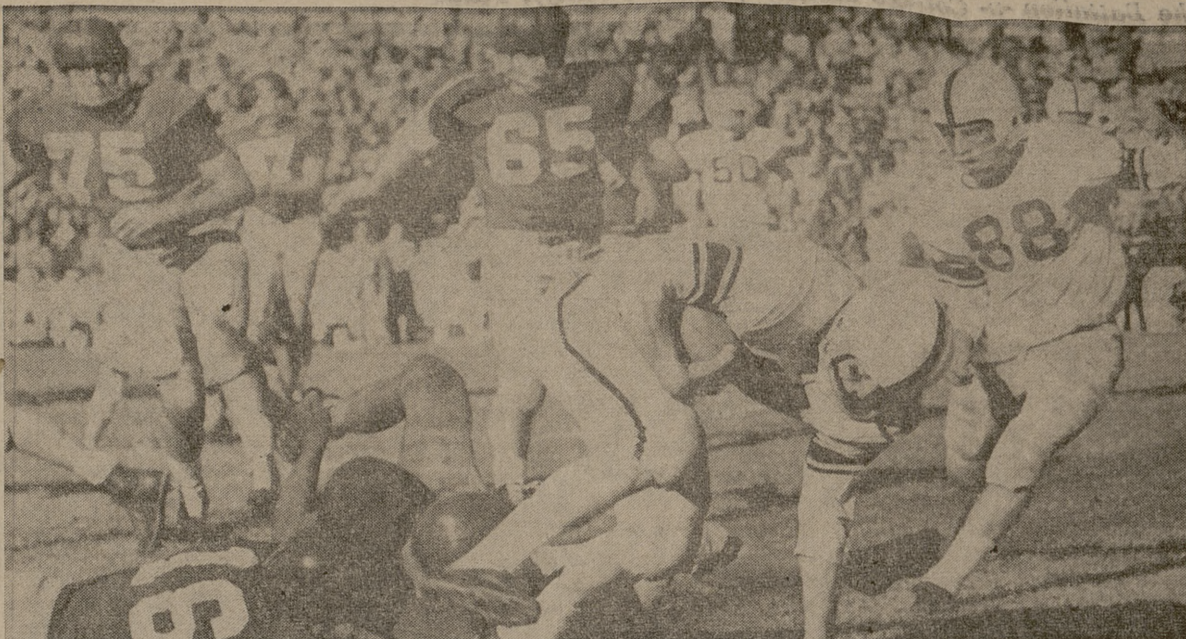
One voter failed to list Oklahoma among the top 10 teams.

"A lot of hard work paid off for Blake," according to Coach Ray Putnam, "He's a good boy with a lot of drive and determination, we have high hopes for him."

Ed Heald was the Aggie's second best runner, finishing sixth in the contest.
