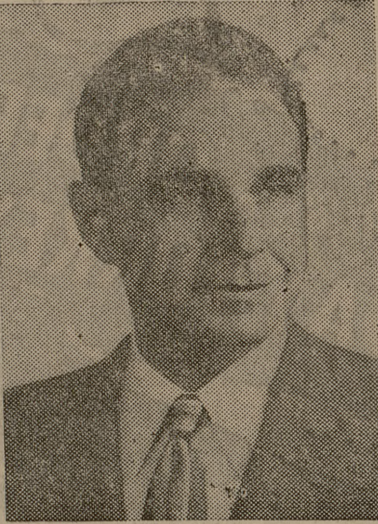
Christian Science Lecturer To Appear Here Monday

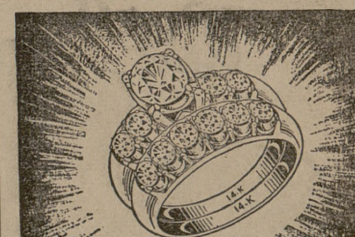

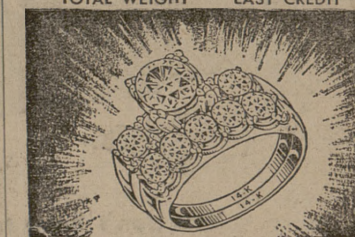

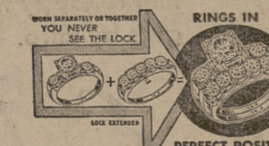
