"And finally, my work with the students, especially the Corps of Cadets, has provided a most thrilling and gratifying experience and will always remain in my memories."

President Morgan came to A&M as Dean of the College in 1952 from Colorado A&M where he was Dean of the College and Dean of the Graduate School. He became president of A&M in September, 1953.

Staying at the Colorado school six and a half years, Dr. Morgan rose from head of the department of education and psychology and director of summer school to the deanships.

He received his bachelor's degree in mathematics at the University of California in 1933 and took his doctor's degree in education administration from the same school in 1938.

He is an elder at the Presbyterian Church here and is affiliated with many scientific societies. He also has been a regular contributor to leading professional journals in the fields of psychology and college administration.

Dr. and Mrs. Morgan have two daughters, Ann, 21, a senior at the University of Texas and Dale, 15, Bryan High School student.
