Bewildered Ponies Edge Aggs, 62-53; Lawrence Leads Fish to Win, 78-63

Out-fought, out-rebounded and out-hustled by the tremendous play of the Texas Aggies, SMU's weary Mustangs hung on to score a 62-53

Southwest Conference victory last night in White Coliseum.

The Aggie Fish, paced by Wayne Lawrence's 31 points, blasted Wharton Junior College, 78-63, in the opener.

Downs Scores 34 as UT Blasts Froggies, 85-76

AUSTIN, (AP)—The Texas Longhorns, shooting at a 55 per cent clip, compiled their all-time high point total against Texas Christian last night in fashioning an 85-76 Southwest Conference victory.

The Longhorns' previous high against TCU was 81 points in 1949. Downs pushed his season's scoring to 296 points for a 24.6 average per game. The Longhorns now own an 8-4 season record and a 1-1 record in conference play.

Sharpshooting Raymond Downs, hitting 11 of 14 field goal attempts and 12 of 13 from the foul line for 34 points, guided the Longhorns to the front. He hit 12 successive points midway in the first half. Texas protected the margin through the second period.

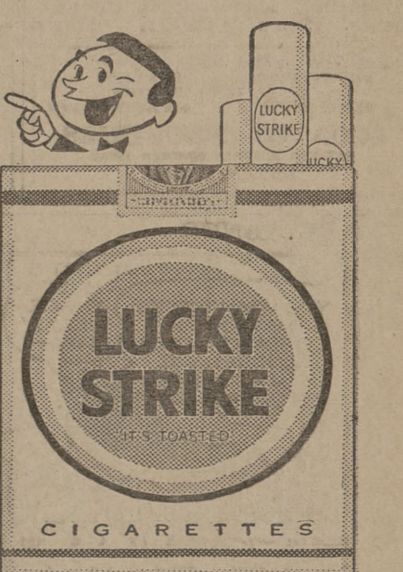
