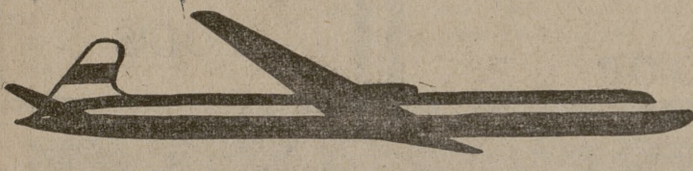

At one time, he stated, it was the richest colony held by France. However, revolutions, droughts and poor resource development have resulted in making it one of the poorest countries in the Western Hemisphere today.
