NEW ORLEANS, (AP)—Mel Parnell, the imperfect no-hit pitcher of the Boston Red Sox, may imitate Don Larsen, the perfect no-hit pitcher of the New York Yankees, and give up his wind-up this year. "I'm sure going to see if this no-wind-up business suits me," Parnell said today. The New Orleans pitcher said Larsen's world series victory, in which no Brooklyn Dodger reached base, highlighted the no wind-up pitch. "Still I don't believe it had anything to do with Larsen's performance that afternoon. He would have gotten his no-hitter whether he pumped or not," Parnell added.

Union Carbide, and as the "like father, like son" saying goes, he is majoring in Civil Engineering. The Swisher family has since moved back to South Charleston, W. Va.

For the season Neil has meshed 97 field goals and 63 free throws in 20 games to run second to teammate George Mehaffey on the Aggie team in scoring with 257 points and a fine season average of 12.8. His average in conference is 12.7 on 102 points scored.

The value of Swisher to the Aggies lies not alone in his scoring consistency but for a guard his rebounding is topped by none in the conference. Clearing the boards of 140 rebounds has netted him an average of 7 per game and prompted Coach Loeffler to call him "the finest 6-1 rebounder I've seen."

In the parlay of football, and this is a football school and state, Neil might be termed a "pursuit tackler," continues Loeffler, "He's always going for the ball."

Neil's best game of the year came against Arkansas here in College Station when he poured through 21 points.

## A 'Must' for Frank

# Lane Wins in '58 Or Else--Busch

ST. LOUIS, (AP)—Frank Lane, baseball's most energetic trader, headed for Florida Wednesday, faced with the task of bringing a National League pennant to St. Louis by 1958 or else.

That's the way owner August A. Busch Jr., laid it on the line to the Redbird general manager in a talk to the "Knights of the Cauliflower Ear" at their annual spring training party last night.

"I expect the Cardinals to come close to winning a pennant in 1957," Busch said, "and 1958 is going to be a sure thing or Frank Lane will be out."

The Cardinals early spring training camp opens tomorrow at St. Petersburg, Fla. That's where the 60-year-old Lane is headed after accepting his boss's challenge like this:

"Mr. Busch very subtly hinted he'd like a pennant. I'd better be very careful sending out my laundry late in the '58 season. Looks like I'm going to be here no longer than three years if I don't win."

"I'm tickled to death to accept Mr. Busch's challenge. If we don't win in '58, I'll be satisfied to move on. That's the rub of the green."

Busch smiled as he delivered his ultimatum to the fast-dealing Lane, who's reshuffled the Cardinals since coming here from the Chicago White Sox. Observers close to Busch, however, felt he wasn't kidding.

The Cardinals finished fourth last season in Lane's first year as general manager after a seventh-place spot in 1955.

Lane will complete a three-year contract with the Cardinals in 1958. He reportedly draws \$40,000 a year with an attendance clause that's understood to have upped his pay to more than \$50,000 last season.
