## Baseball Regulars Win Squad Game

The A&M baseball team greeted clear skies and warmer weather with another intrasquad game, continuing spring training prior to opening the season with Houston's Cougars at 2 p. m. Saturday on Kyle Field.

Divided into two squads, a team composed of probable starters eas-

ed by the second team, 6-5, behind the pitching of Dick Munday of Bryan and Paul Lang of Arlington.

Sophomore catcher Gary Herrington of Baytown, with a double and single, paced the first team at the plate. Jim Smotherman, right fielder from Frisco, with a double and Doug Mullins, second baseman from Wichita Falls, with a single, also provided hitting support.

Coach Beau Bell has announced no starting lineup, but starters for the first team spring-training squad were: shortstop Joe Worden of Apalachicola, Fla.; first-baseman John Hoyle of Longview; third-baseman Lyle "Hoot" Gibson of Galena Park; Smotherman; Herrington; Mullins; centerfielder Cliff Tuttle of Houston and left-fielder Wendell Reed of Jefferson.

The second team lineup consisted of shortstop Wayne Balke of Baytown; first-baseman Wayne Schaper of Galveston; third-baseman Gene Wortham; right-fielder Leland Lantz of Houston; catcher Lou Nelson of San Antonio; second-baseman Lupe Fraga of Houston; St. Thomas; center-fielder Dickie Thomas of Dallas and left-fielder Behn Hubbard of Cuero.

Likely starter on the mound in the season opener is captain Dick Munday and he will probably split time with Lefty Toby Newton of Galveston.

## Missouri Valley Unable to Trace Gambling Hints

ST. LOUIS, (AP)—The Missouri Valley Conference has been unable to trace rumors linking one of its basketball officials with gambling interests but is calling a committee meeting to pursue an investigation, the conference president said Wednesday.

"We have found no truth to any of the rumors," said the Rev. Charles L. Sanderson, S.J., of St. Louis University, the conference president. "It seems impossible to pin down the rumors. Nothing concrete has developed."

Father Sanderson disclosed the conference is calling a meeting in St. Louis of its officials committee to conduct a full investigation and is awaiting replies from the members before setting a date.

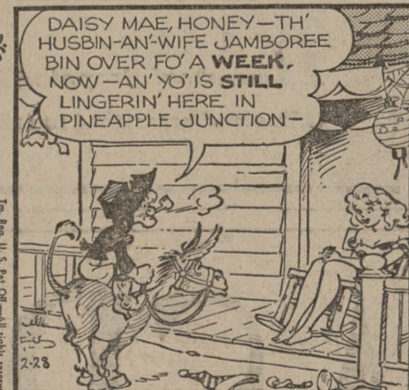
