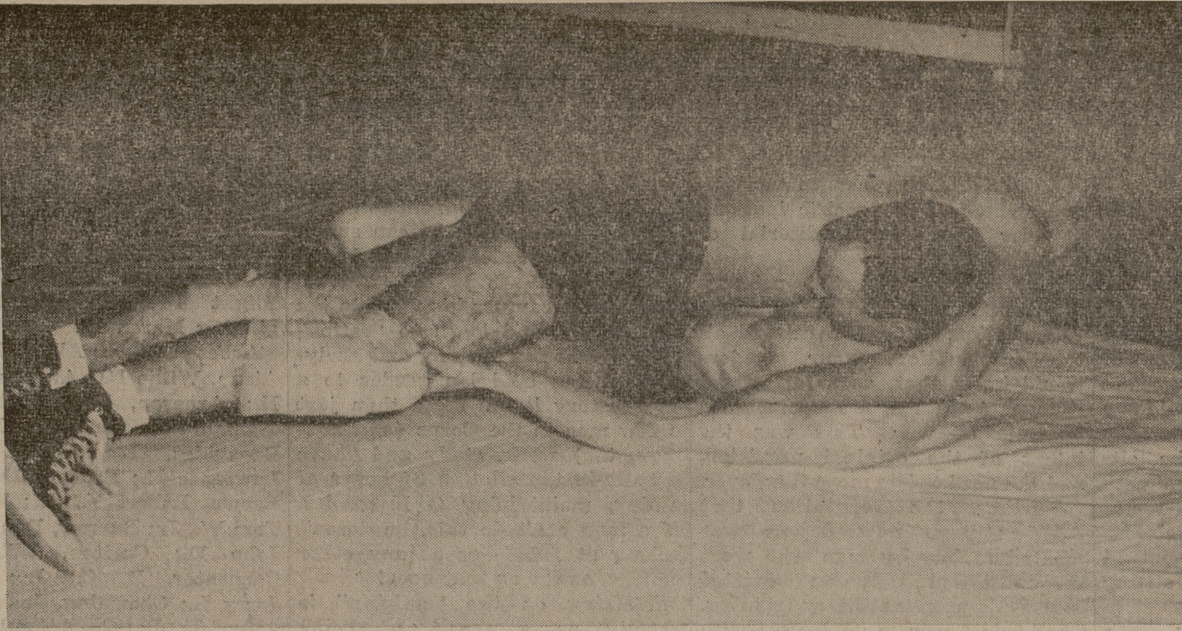

SWC Starts Thursday

Swimmers Crush Texas Tech, 60-11

Warming up for their Southwest Conference title defense Thursday, Friday and Saturday in Houston, Coach Art Adamson's Aggie swimmers mauled Texas Tech, 60-11, in Downs Natatorium Friday night.

Scheduled for Saturday, the Red Raiders showed up a day early, so the meet came off at night. A&M's Fish, who had downed Houston's Lamar High, 45-32, Friday afternoon went back into the water to sweep all four events with a 28-3 victory over the Tech frosh.

Only Tech's Bob Shackelford broke the Aggie monopoly on firsts, winning the 200-yard backstroke with Joe Steer and Jimmy Dye right on his heels. A&M captured seven of the eight events.

Adamson swam almost every man in his squad, but the youngest member of the SWC couldn't keep pace with the league champs.

The Fish took seven of nine events against Lamar High in the afternoon swim fest, losing only freestyle relay. Orlando Cossani won the 100-

yard breaststroke and the individual medley against the Redskins then swam to a first in the 100 yard butterfly against Tech.

Besides winning seven of eight firsts, the Aggie varsity swept the second-place points.

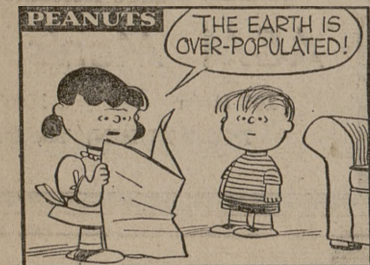

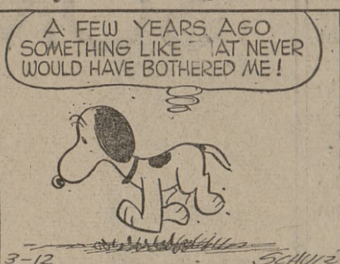

Corps Baseball Starts Monday for 1st Time

Two leagues have been formed, one composed of Air Force groups and the other made up of Army battalions. Each league will have seven teams, with each team scheduled to play 21 games.

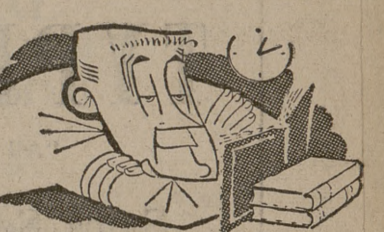
SMU Fourth as Tar Heels Top Final AP Cage Poll

The Associated Press The North Carolina Tar Heels, unbeaten in 27 games, Monday broke the two-year hold of the San Francisco Dons by finishing in first place by an overwhelming margin in the final Associated Press college basketball poll of the 1956-1957 campaign. The Tar Heels, winners of the Atlantic Coast Conference tournament last week, were given the No. 1 distinction by 55 of the 76 sports writers and broadcasters who participated in the final vote.

On the usual basis of 10 points for first place, nine for second, etc., North Carolina received 725 points. Kansas was second with 602 points followed by Kentucky with 479, Southern Methodist with 437 and Seattle, 302.

In the final voting, West Virginia and St. Louis moved into the top 10 replacing Michigan State and UCLA.

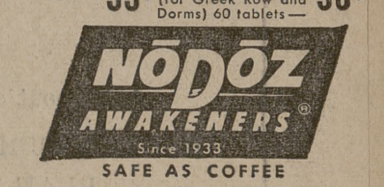
