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





WASHINGTON, (AP)-A federal grand jury yesterday indicated two Teamsters Union vice presidents and two lesser Teamsters officials on charges of contempt of Congress.

The vice presidents indicted were Einar O. Mohn of Washington, top administrator of the 11/2million member union under President Dave Beck, and Frank W. Brewster, Seattle, who is also chairman of the 11-state Western Conference of Teamsters.

The indictments came during a recess in hearings of the Senate committee investigating alleged racketeering in labor and industry.


