

RIBING CONDITIONS UND I BITCHES SHALL BE PENI UTHORIZING THE REQUIREM L DOGS TO BE MUZZLED UN-AIN CIRCUMSTANCES, DI RI THE CHIEF OF POLICE TO D OR KILL DOGS UNDER (CONDITIONS, PROVIDING REDEMPTION OF IMPOUN THE REDEMPTION OF IMPOUNDED DOGS, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY AND REPEALING ORDINANCES NO. 50 and NO. 137. BE IT ORDAINED by the City Counc the City of College Station, Texas:

LEGAL NOTICE

ORDINANCE NO. 248

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING THE LI-DENSING OF DOGS, PROVIDING THE MANNER OF SECURING LICENSES, PRESCRIBING CONDITIONS UNDER

of the City of College Station, Texas: I. No person shall allow a dog owned by im or in his care to run at large within he city limits unless a license for such dog as been secured and is in effect, unless uch dog is effectively immunized against ables, and unless evidence of both such icense and immunization are indicated by tag or tags, provided by or under the irection of the city, attached to a collar orn by the dog. II. In order to obtain a license for a og the following requirements must be het:

Making application to the city on forms provided for that purpose. Attaching a certificate from a licensed veterinarian that the dog has been inoculated against rables recently enough for such inoculation to be ef-

incentitied against inoculation to be ef-fective during the period for which the license is to be effective. Paying a license fee for a fiscal year or fraction thereof, according to the following schedule: (1) one dollar for a male or spayed female. (2) one dollar for a bitch.

(2) one dollar for a bitch.

III. No person shall allow a bitch owned 7 him or in his care to run at large hile she is in heat.

thile she is in heat. IV. The Chief of Police is hereby direc-ed to capture and impound any dog run-ing at large which is not wearing an ef-ective license and rabies tag or tags or ny bitch in heat even if wearing such ags. If it is impossible for him to cap-are such dog, he is hereby authorized to ill the same. build you on odeling siness ARION NY for 6-5711

kill the same. V. The Mayor is hereby authorized at any time when in his judgment there are rabid dogs in the city and the public health is thereby endangered, to issue a proclama-tion forbidding the running at large of any logs not muzzled. Upon issuance of such proclamation, the Chief of Police is hereby inected to capture and impound if possible, nd if not, then to kill, any dogs running t large without muzzles. VI. Any dog impounded under the

t large without muzzies. VI. Any dog impounded under the pro-isions of this ordinance may be recovered y its owner or keeper within forty-eigh ours from the time of such impoundment y the payment of the city fee of two dol-urs and fifty cents (\$2.50).

Any dog that bites any person or s suspected of having rabies or needs to e under observation shall be placed in the nimal hospital in A&M College, and the wher of said dog shall be responsible or the fees charged, and failure to pay ald fees shall make the owner of said og subject to the fines hereinafter stated, nd the City shall have the authority to do way with any dog after proper notice has een given to its owner.

VIII. All license fees and other fees pro-ided herein shall go into the treasury of he city to be used for paying the expenses t enforcing this ordinance.

IX. Any person violating the ordinance. hall be fined not to exceed fifty (\$50.00), ollars. Violations of Sections I and III of his ordinance shall each constitute a sep-rate offense, and each day such viola-on of either section continues shall also institute a separate offense.
