Weightlifters Bid For Recognition

One of A&M's little-known teams, or rather "clubs", the weightlifters, will be bidding for a taste of recognition Saturday when they travel to Houston to match their talents against an array of competition at the Southern United States YMCA and AAU weightlifting meet.

About 70 muscle-men will participate in the tournament. Other than A&M, such institutions as Texas University, Rice Institute and Louisiana State University—which held the Junior National Championship two years ago—are entered, along with various YMCA clubs and individual entries.

The Aggies have entered two tournaments thus far this year, winning one and placing second in the other.

Their first outing, in January's Houston Odd-Lift contest, found them being nosed out by one point at the hands of Houston's Southside Lifting Club. On March 16, they walked away from the Region III meet in Houston with a decisive victory. A&M took four first-place

and one second-place titles. The Ags were scheduled to enter the state tournament in Waco on March 30, but the self-supported and coached club was not able to make the necessary arrangements.

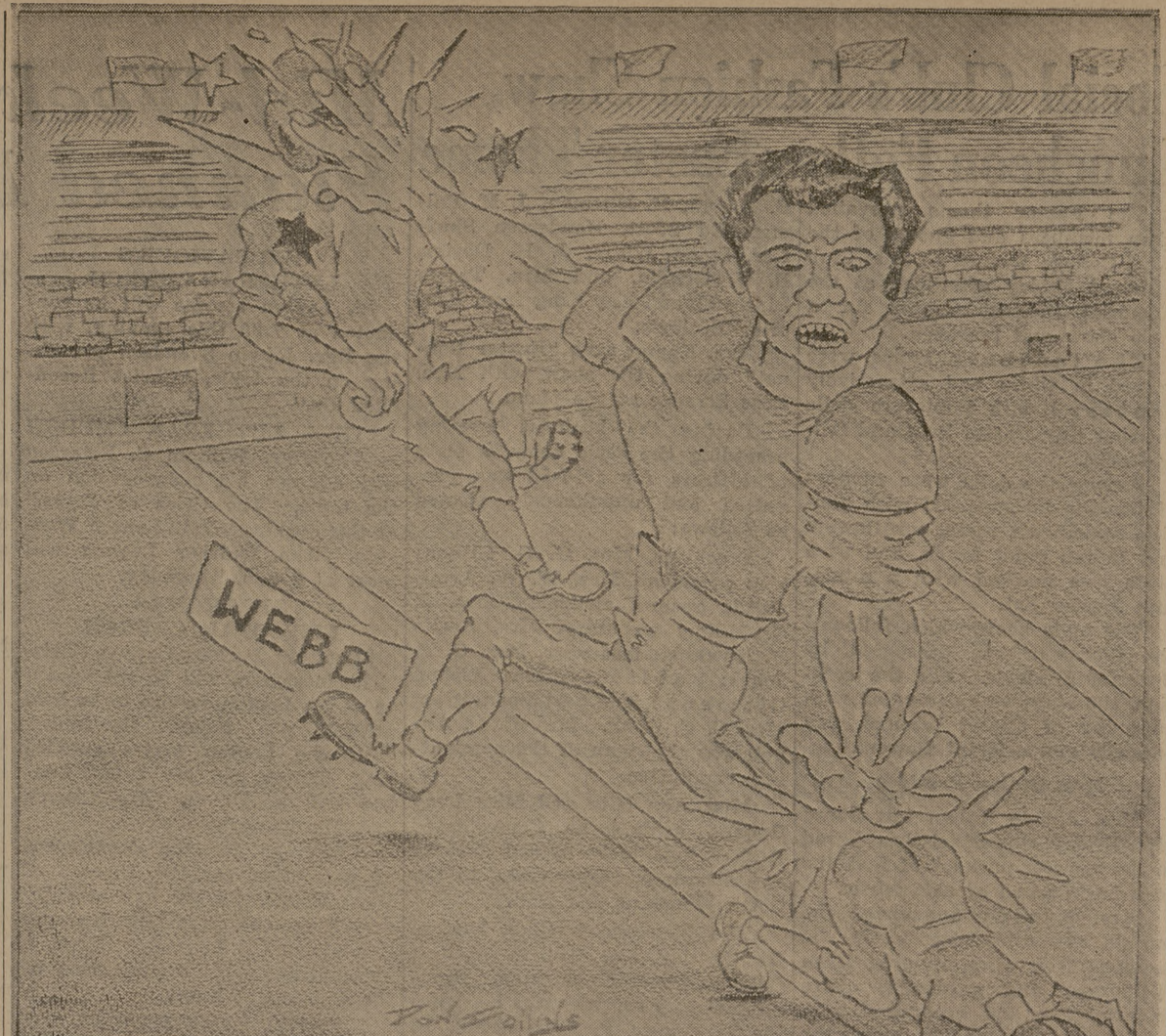

A&M's Don Watson Joins Va. Tech Coaching Staff

A&M's great little halfback, Don Watson, joined the staff of Virginia Tech last week as assistant football coach, according to Frank Moseley, head grid coach and athletic director.

Watson, the 150-pounder who personally beat TCU twice, was a standout in the Blue-Gray game at Montgomery, Ala., last December as well as making a number of all-Southwest Conference second teams.

Tech opened Spring training last Wednesday with Watson joining Macauley McEver, Alf Satterfield, Buck Chapman, Dick Redding, Chuck Noe and Red Laird on the staff. He will receive his B.A. degree in education in June.

"Having been associated with Coach (Paul) Bryant for many years, I know that few people receive such a high recommendation as he gave Don, and I know that he will be a great help to our backs," said Coach Moseley. "We are especially pleased that he was able to arrive in time for Spring training."

Watson, the Franklin speedster, will long be remembered for his title-saving interception of Chuck Curtis' pass in the A&M end zone early in the fourth quarter of the Aggies' 7-6 victory over TCU.

Golfers Meet NTSC Thursday; Rice Friday

Coach Joe Fagan's A&M golfing team hosts the strong North Texas Eagles here Thursday prior to opening the 1956 Southwest Conference golfing season with the Rice Owls on the Brae Burn course in Houston Friday.

Five golfers, led by last year's SWC medalist champion Bobby Nichols of Louisville, Ky., comprise the squad for the Houston trip and they will also see action against the Eagles. Others on the squad are Marcelino Moreno, Binky Mitchella, Jerry Durbin and Gary Fletcher.

Only a week ago the Aggies defeated North Texas in Denton with all linkmen firing par or under golf and paced by Nichol's 3-under 69. Mitchella and Moreno each won their singles matches, Durbin and Fletcher losing and the Aggies halving the two team matches.

Jack Vaughan, freshman golfer from Fort Worth, won the Conroe Invitational golf tournament championship flight, dropping Miller Barber, an Aggie-ex, 3 and 2, in the finals over the weekend. He had earlier whipped Jimmy Powell, one of North Texas better golfers. The Aggie freshmen played the Texas frosh in Austin Tuesday. Results were not available.
