

# Holy Week To Be Climaxed Sunday By Special Easter Church Services

Local churches will celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus Christ in special Easter services Sunday. Many have scheduled sunrise services in addition to their regular worship hours.

**BETHEL LUTHERAN CHURCH**  
Sunrise services are planned for 5:30 a.m. at the Skyway Drive-in Theatre. The regular morning services will include sermons on the topic, "The Resurrection of Jesus," by the Rev. William C. Petersen. The Lord's Supper will be celebrated at Maundy Thursday services at 7:45 p.m. The 7:45 p.m. Good Friday service will include a sermon by the Rev. Petersen on "The Funeral of Jesus."

**A&M CHRISTIAN CHURCH**  
Old Highway 6 south of Kyle Field "The Power and Glory of Easter" has been selected by Dr. W. C. Jones for his sermon at the Easter morning service. Special Easter music will be offered by the choir, and baptism will be administered at the close of the service.

Aggie Religious Study Group

will not meet this evening due to the Easter recess.

**CHRISTIAN SCIENCE SOCIETY**  
"The vital importance for men today of Christ Jesus' victory over death" will be emphasized at Easter Sunday services.

Readings from the King James Version of the Bible and from "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy will comprise the lesson-sermon entitled "Doctrine of Atonement." From John will be read the account of Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection.

Another in the series of radio programs, "How Christian Science Heals," will be heard at 9:45 a.m. next Tuesday.

At the first service special music will be offered by the combined junior and senior choirs. Raymond Hite will present a vocal solo at the second worship hour. A special Easter service for the children will be conducted at 3:30 p. m., with a party and egg hunt to follow the sermon.
