

Accountants Come Here for Meeting

Accounting authorities from across the nation will speak here on all phases of accounting during the tenth annual Accounting Conference April 29-30.

The opening session will begin with talks by Carman G. Blough, director of research at the American Institute of Accountants, New York, who will speak on "Current Developments in Accounting and Auditing." And J. D. Zahn, Continental Can Co., New York, will talk on "Effective Cost Control."

Ralph S. Clifford, Deere and Co., Moline, Ill., will speak on the "Responsibility of the Accountant in the Field of Labor Relations."

Charles Bogart will discuss "Work Simplification" at a Tuesday afternoon panel discussion.

Subcommittee Promises Insurance Bill

AUSTIN, (AP) — A house subcommittee promised last night it would have some sort of bill Monday night for reorganization of the state insurance commission—a pet legislative project of Gov. Daniel.

The report to the House State Affairs Committee, made by Rep. Obie Bristow, in effect postponed any further action on the governor's demands until next week.

It also meant that any such reorganization plan, if approved by the committee, would have to compete with hundreds of other pending bills in the waning days of the legislature.

Bristow read a statement in which he said the subcommittee found no "substantial change" from present law in two reorganization proposals sent it for study, except that they dispensed with the present commission.

He said his three-man group had studied the two bills from two aspects.

First, "whether either or both would actually accomplish the purpose for which they were presented."

Second, "whether there is deliberately or otherwise an attempt here to set policy and take action by indirect means that conflicts with other provisions of our constitution and laws."

"We will have a bill to present you Monday night," he said in conclusion.

In answer to questions, Chairman W. S. Heatley said he would offer any such bill for discussion and would recognize requests for final votes on the measure Monday night.

Bogart is a representative of Prudential Life Insurance Company of America, Houston.

"Work Simplification Techniques," will be discussed by F. C. Lawrence, Arthur Andersen and Co., Houston, at the same panel discussion.

The final part of the panel discussion will be an address made by James L. Beck, on "How Work Simplification Has Been Applied at Humble Oil and Refining Co."

R. L. Gantner, comptroller for General Motors Corp., N. Y., will deliver an address on "An Application of Internal Control" at the Tuesday session.

"How du Pont Measures Performance," will be discussed by H. Wallace Evans, of the E. I. du Pont de Nemours and Co., Wilmington, Del.

At a 7 p.m. banquet, L. B. McLaughlin, partner in the Arthur Young and Co., Chicago, will speak on "The Accountant as a Counselor to Top Management."
