David A. Claghorn, junior entomology student, was awarded a \$100 scholarship as the outstanding junior majoring in entomology Tuesday night by Dean of Agriculture J. C. Miller.

Selection for the award was made on the junior's scholarship, attitude, ability, personality, extracurricular activities, financial needs and a 500-word theme on "Why I Selected Entomology for a Career?", according to J. C. Gaines, head of the Entomology Department.

The scholarship was made available by the Texas Pest Control Operators.

On presenting the award Dean Miller said, "We are living in an age where we must work with people," and there grades and personality come into play especially when a job interviewer is on the campus. "This was not true several years ago, but it is now." He credited this to the fast, modern world in which we are now living. "It is a world where ability to get along with people" is a necessity, he added.

Before taking his present position, he was director general of FAO, with headquarters in Rome, Italy.

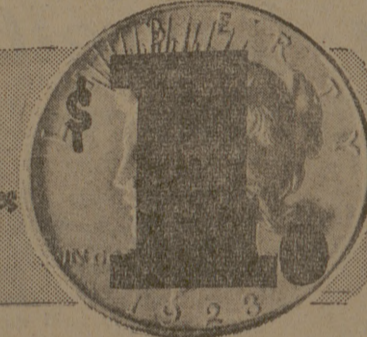

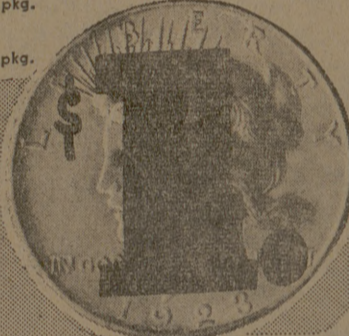

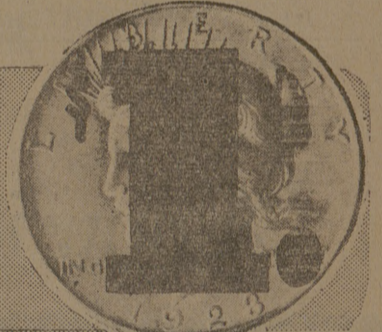
