Consolidated High School made a clean sweep of the Interscholasitic League one-act play finals Thursday night in Austin, taking first place in the play contest. They provided the best male actor and placed all three members of the cast on the All-State play cast.

Bill Hite, Patsy Williams and Charles Delaplane won the state championship in the AA division with their presentation of Anton Chekov's "The Proposal." Bill Hite was named outstanding male actor for his portrayal of the young lover who tries in vain to propose to his sweetheart.


