Elementary Math Course Offered to Local Teachers

A three-week mathematics improvement course, for grades one through eight, is being conducted at A&M to meet the current American trend toward an increasing need for scientists.

Lyle Hanse, head of the research division and educational consultant for Winston Publishing Co., Philadelphia, is conducting the course which emphasizes that a clear understanding of elementary mathematics is a necessary foundation for tomorrow's scientists.

Offered as a workshop in mathematics by the A&M Department of Education and Psychology for teacher improvement in public schools, the course is directed by W. R. Carmichael, superintendent, Bryan public schools, and covers a simplified method of teaching use of whole numbers and fractions to grade school children, Dr. Grady P. Parker, department head, declared.

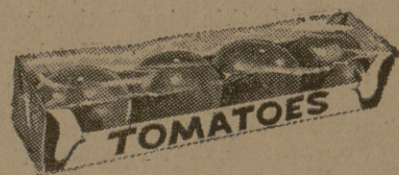
