CASSEROLE DISHES

8-ounce package macaroni

1 teaspoon salt 1 can condensed tomato soup 2 tablespoons olive oil 1 pound lean ground beef 1 can condensed bouillon 1 package frozen peas

1/2 cup chopped onion 1/s teaspoon pepper marjoram or oregano

Cook macaroni according to directions on package. Heat olive oil and cook beef and onions until lightly browned. To this add tomato soup, bouillon, peas, and seasonings. Stir until peas are thawed. Add macaroni and pour into 2-quart casserole. Top with buttered crumbs and bake in 350-degree oven for about 30 minutes. 1 Kraft Dinner

1 pound ground beef

1 cup diced onion

1 cup diced green pepper

4 slices cheese Boil meat, onion and green pepper for 15 minutes in just enough water to prevent burning. Cook Kraft Dinner for 7 minutes (saving ground cheese out) and add to meat mixture. Add corn and season with salt, pepper and a little garlic salt if desired. Stir cheese contained in the Dinner into this mixture. Pour into casserole, and lay the 4 slices of cheese on top. ½ teaspoon vanilla 1/2 cup milk

2 tablespoons butter Beat eggs, add sugar and vanilla and beat again. Sift dry ingredients together and add. Heat milk and butter to boiling point and add last. Beat well. Bake about 30 minutes at 350 degrees in a shallow 9-inch pan. TOPPING

1/3 cup softened butter

% cup brown sugar 1/4 cup evaporated milk 1 cup cocoanut ½ cup pecans (chopped)

1 cup flour

¼ teaspoon salt

½ cup coarse crumbs (buttered)

1 No. 2 can creamed corn

1 teaspoon baking powder


