### Singles Play First

A field of 59 netters is set to begin play Monday in the first annual College Station Recreation Council Tennis Tournament.

The week-long, county-wide affair is due to get underway at 8 a.m. Monday when first round activity is slated in the 13-and-under and 14-15 age divisions on the A&M cement tennis courts (located south of Kyle Field). Monday at 5:30 p.m., action begins in the other two age classifications—16-18 and 19-and-over.

Singles play is slated for Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday, while doubles competition is on tap for Thursday and Friday. Finals in all events are scheduled for Saturday, August 3.

The champion of the men's 19-and-over singles division will receive a trophy, while the runner-up is to receive a ribbon. The winners and runners-up in each of the other divisions are to be presented ribbons.

# Rec Council Tankers Swim At Houston Olympic Meet

Houston's Junior Olympics Swimming Meet moves into its second day of competition today, numbering 24 participants from the College Station Recreation Council among 23 events in two divisions.

Twelve local tankers saw action yesterday in the 10-and-under division: Susan Braley and Margaret Brown, girls' 25 yd. breast stroke; Steve Darwall, boys' 25 yd. breast stroke; Suzanne Medlen and Virginia Patterson, girls' 25 yd. backstroke; Charles Castle and Jim

Amyx, boys' 25 yd. backstroke; Barbara Ewens, girls' 25 yd. freestyle; David Brusse and Randy Darwall, boys' 25 yd. freestyle; Sharon Covey, girls' 25 yd. butterfly; Tommy Kahan, boys' 25 yd. butterfly.

Additional College Station entries included girls' 100 yd. medley relay—Medlen, Brown, Covey, and Braley (alternate, Patterson); boys' 100 yd. medley relay—Castle, S. Darwall, Kahan, and R. Darwall (alternate, Amyx); girls' 100 yd. freestyle relay—Brown, Ewens, Braley, and Covey (alternates, Patterson and Medlen); boys' 100 yd. freestyle—Amyx, Kahan, R. Darwall, and S. Today's events are in the 11-12 division, with all the individual events being a distance of 50 yards. The College Station Swim Club, taking fourth place in the senior girls' (15-16) division team standings, competed in the Texas Open AAU Swimming and Diving Championships last week-end in Austin's Northwest Park Pool.

Pam Hayes swept to a first place in the intermediate girls' (13-14) division, and her time of 3:41.1 went into the books as a new record since this is the first year that the Texas Open AAU swimming gathering has been held. She teamed with Gail Schlesselman, Mary Frances Badgett, and Judy Litton to take second place in the senior girls' 400 meter medley relay.

Miss Schlesselman captured second place in the senior girls' 100 meter butterfly and finished third in the senior girls' 200 meter individual medley. Miss Badgett took sixth place in the senior girls' 100 meter backstroke, while Miss Litton won fifth place in the senior girls' 100 meter freestyle.

Joe Brusse, in the intermediate boys' 400 meter freestyle, placed eighth.

In the senior boys' division, Bill Farrar nailed down second place in the 200 meter breast stroke and seventh spot in the 200 meter individual relay; Howard Mitchell, in the same classification, placed seventh in the 100 meter butterfly.

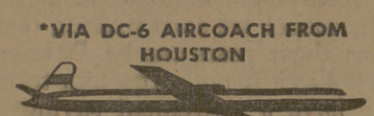
