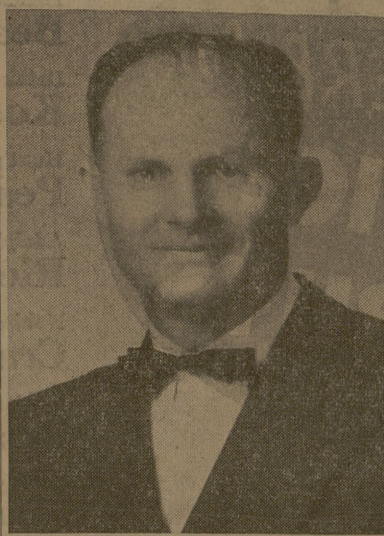
During his absence, Dr. William C. Jones of Dallas served as interim pastor.

GREENWICH, Conn. (AP)—Pert, blonde Lee Adorney runs a good-sized country home, takes care of four small children, pampers her New York adman husband—and in her spare time turns out a line of greeting cards which have caught on like wildfire among the modern-minded off-beat customers.

A former fashion illustrator, Lee met her husband, Charles, while both were students at Pratt Institute in Brooklyn. She wanted a home and children, and acquired them with no delay. But was that any reason to sink into a rut of unrelieved domesticity? Not for Lee.

When she was approached by the owners of a bookstore in nearby Darien to work up some sketches for a new line of greeting cards, Lee got out her sketch pad and went to work. The result was a gremlin-like little character who promptly was christened Ad-Lib, looks like nothing human, but seems to have a strange appeal for the more sophisticated sector of the general public.

After an enthusiastic initial response from the public, Ad-Lib graduated to the sponsorship of a national greeting card manufacturer, and soon will be popping up all over the country.

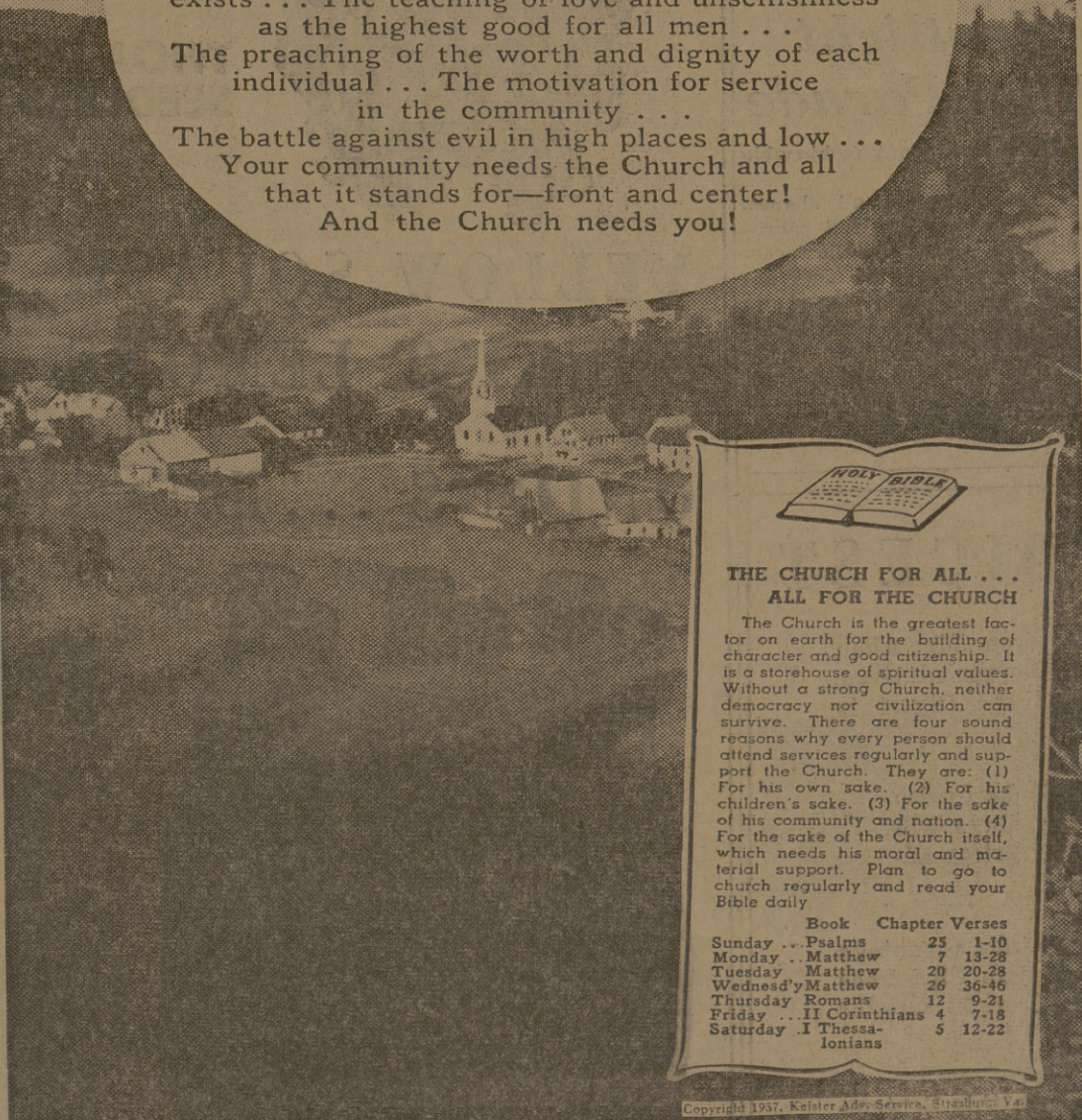
FRONT and CENTER!
