(Editor's Note: Following are some of the prize bread-and-roll recipes which have been contributed by our readers.)

## HOMEMADE BREAD

1/2 cup sugar	1 1/2 cups cool water
1 cup lukewarm water	7 cups flour
1 package dry yeast	1 1/2 teaspoons salt
1/2 cup shortening	

Dissolve sugar in lukewarm water. Sprinkle in yeast and let stand 5 minutes or longer. Melt shortening and add cool water. Sift together flour and salt. Make a well in the flour and pour in shortening water and add yeast water.

Mix well and knead hard on a bread board for 5 minutes. Put in a greased bowl and let rise in a warm place until double in size. Divide in half and make two loaves. Let rise again until double in size. Then bake in a pre-heated oven (350 degrees) for 1 hour.

## CHEESE PIMIENTO BREAD

2 tablespoons soft butter or margarine	1/2 cup (or more) sharp flavored grated cheese
2 tablespoons flour	2 or 3 (or more) tablespoons minced pimiento
1 tablespoon sugar	1/4 cup lukewarm water
2 teaspoons salt	1 cake compressed yeast
1 1/2 cups milk	3 to 3 1/2 cups sifted flour

Combine in a large saucepan the butter, flour, sugar, and salt. Stir in the milk and cook, stirring over low heat until thickened. Add cheese and pimiento and stir until cheese is melted. Cool to lukewarm. Mix together the yeast and water and add. Mix in flour.

Knead and let rise twice. Shape into loaf (9 by 5 3-inch pan). Let rise 1 1/2 times its size (about 30 minutes). Bake at 375 degrees 45 to 50 minutes.

## LACY ROLLS

1/2 cup molasses	1 cup sifted plain flour
1/2 cup shortening or butter	1/2 teaspoon salt
1 tablespoon ginger	3/4 cup granulated sugar

Heat molasses to boiling point. Add butter or shortening and stir well. Mix and sift the dry ingredients and slowly add to first mixture, stirring constantly. Drop one-half tablespoon at a time about 3 or 4 inches apart on greased baking sheet.

Bake in moderate oven (350 degrees) until snaps are golden brown (8 to 10 minutes). Allow to cool slightly, remove, and wrap quickly around the handle of a wooden spoon into a roll; remove. Makes 5 dozen rolls.

## REFRIGERATOR WHOLE WHEAT ROLLS

1 cup all-bran	1/2 cup hot water
1 cup hot water	1/2 cup milk
3/4 cup sugar	1 yeast cake
7 tablespoons melted bacon drippings	1 egg, beaten
1 teaspoon salt	6 cups flour

Combine first 5 ingredients in a bowl and let sit until lukewarm. Pour together hot water and milk and let cool. Add yeast and egg. Add this and flour to first mixture. Mix well. Let rise until double in bulk. Then work down dough and cover and put in the refrigerator or make into rolls immediately.

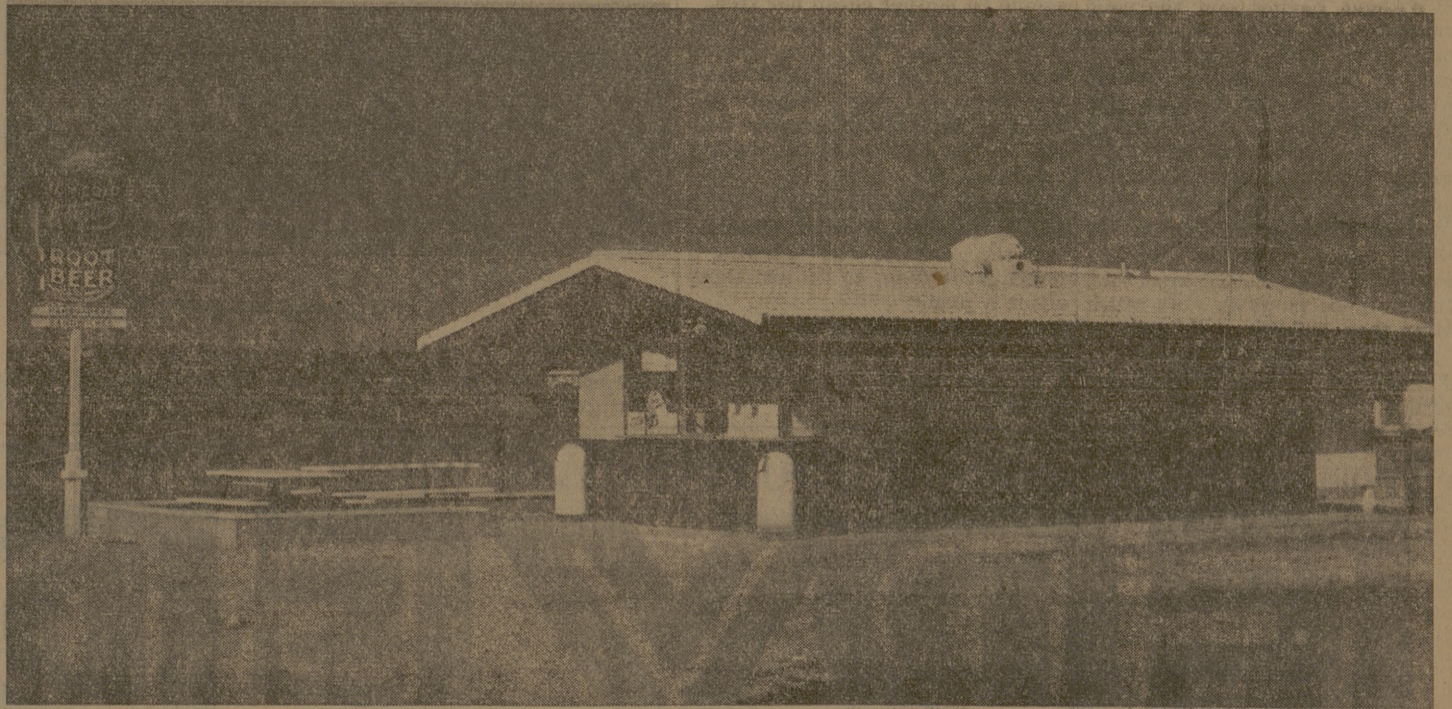
## 'Two By Two' Class Open To Aggies, Their Wives

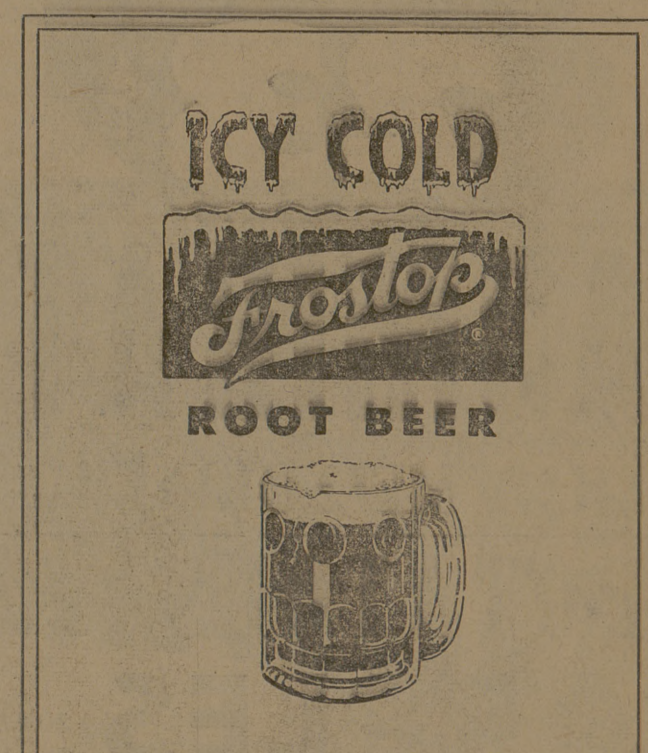
