

## Expert Talks On Meat Quality

Dr. F. E. Deatherage, head of the Department of Agricultural Biochemistry, Ohio State University, will talk on "The Nature of Quality in Meat" at 8 p.m., Friday, Oct. 11 in the lecture room of the Biological Science Building.

The authority on food research will discuss the biochemical and physiological nature of tenderness, juiciness, flavor, color and texture along with implications to the live-

stock and meat processing industries at the Oct. 11 presentation.

A native of Illinois, Deatherage graduated from Illinois College in 1935 with a degree in chemistry, and received his Ph.D. in biochemistry from the University of Iowa in 1938. He has written many books in the field, and in recent years has been interested in the use of anti-biotics in foods.

Faculty members, graduate students and the public have been invited to the meat lecture.
