basketball team—for the second time within the period of one short week.

This past Saturday afternoon, before a partisan crowd of 5,307 basketball fans and a Midwest regional television audience, Aggie Coach Bobby Rogers' unknown Cadets came from behind in the fourth quarter with nine straight points to overcome a five-point deficit of 60-55, and post the second win of their Eastern tour, 72-69.

The Cadets were anything but "lady-like" however, as they showed the Big Ten powerhouse the value of being raised on sagebrush and sand.

Forty-three fouls were called during the contest, with the rough-house Aggies taking the call on 23 occasions.

Wayne Lawrence, 6-9 center from Pawcatuck, Conn. was the game's leading scorer with 17 points. However, there were four other Cadets in the double scoring column. Buckeye Ken Sidle was second highest with 16 points. Neil Swisher scored 13 to become runner-up to Lawrence for the Aggies.

Ohio State gave the ball away on 19 occasions, but managed to control the backboards with some degree of proficiency. Their big three, Frank Howard, Larry Huston and Sidle cleaned 31 of the 41 bounce-backs off the boards. The Aggies lost the ball but three times.

The lead changed hands several times throughout the game with the Buckeyes holding a 36-35 edge at the half. The Aggies scored first but OSU took the lead and

relinquished it only twice during the first half. Midway in the second quarter, the Buckeyes led by nine points, at 23-14.

With 7:48 remaining in the fourth quarter, the Farmers overcame a five-point deficit with a

sudden burst of production. They scored nine-straight points, and when the smoke had cleared, the Cadets led by 64-60.

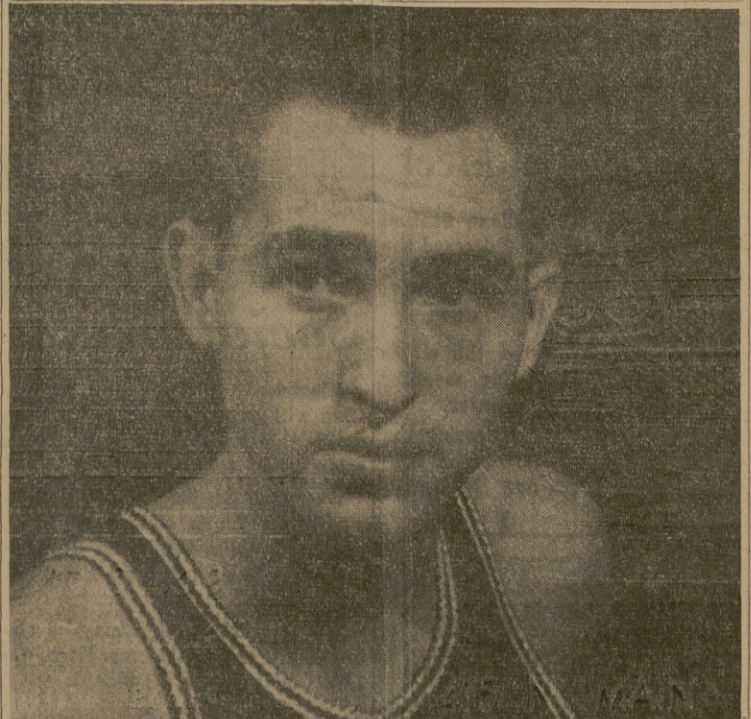
That was essentially the story, as Ohio State felt the sting of Texas athletes for the second time this year. Texas Christian University's unfriendly Horned Frogs outstrip-

ped the Buckeyes' football team, last September, 18-14 in one of the best upsets of the season.

The Aggies will contest Temple University at Philadelphia tonight and return to College Station to prepare for Southwest Conference tourney in Houston during the Christmas holidays.

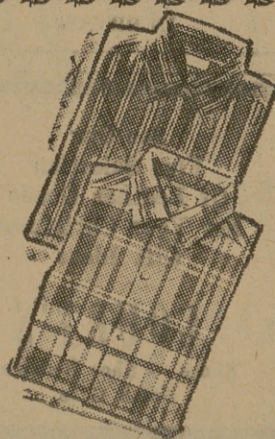

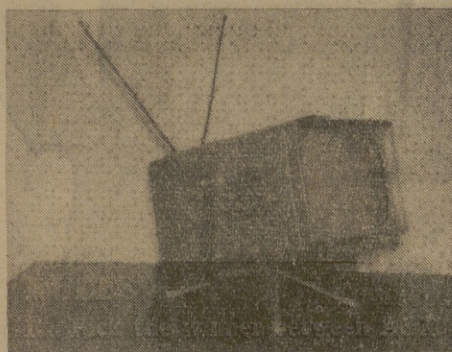

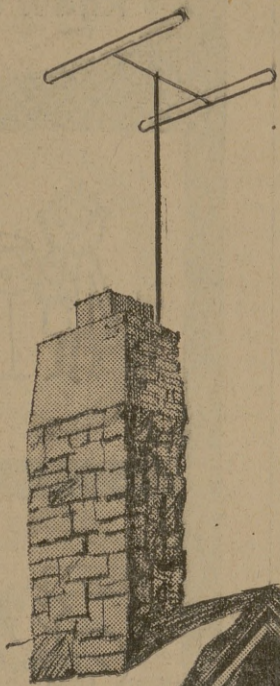
