Temple University, the "Cadilof East Coast basketball squads handed the Texas Aggies a 60-44 shellacking last night in Philadelphia.

The Owls, on the rebound after osing to sixth ranked Kentucky and seventh - ranked Cincinnati, were in complete control of the Cadets for the entire game.

Temple was last year's thirdplace NIT team, returning every starter from the squad including two All-American candidates.

One of their selections, Guy Rodgers, a red-hot 6-footer, engineered the defeat. He paced the Owls with 22 points, which was high for the game.

Neil Swisher, flashy guard from Victoria was the leading point producer for the Cadets with 11 points. Temple has been named one of the best collegiate teams in the nation, and currently is ranked twelfth in the nation — the best team the Aggies were to face on their Globetrotter tour.




