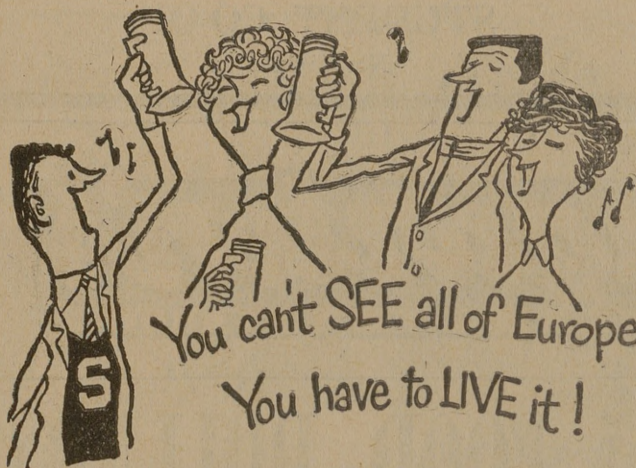


Social Whirl

FRESH APPLE PIE

4-5 apples ½ pound butter
 1 cup sugar 1 cup brown sugar
 4 tablespoons water 1 cup flour
 Pare and slice apples. Fill a pie pan with them, and cover apples with 1 cup white sugar and water. Then cream butter and brown sugar, and slowly work in flour. Place on a piece of waxed paper and roll or pat mixture to cover pie. Place over top of apples and bake pie at 325 degrees for 45 minutes or until brown. Serve with whipped cream.

PECAN MACAROONS

1 egg white 2½ cups pecans, cut lengthwise
 ¼ cup light brown sugar
 Beat egg white until stiff. Add sugar gradually. Work in the nuts. Drop mixture from a teaspoon onto a greased and lightly floured cookie sheet. Bake at 300 degrees for 15 minutes. Remove from cookie sheet and cool. Makes 4 to 5 dozen.

LEMON ICE BOX PUDDING

1½ cups vanilla wafer crumbs juice and grated rind of 1 lemon
 1 envelope gelatin 3 tablespoons butter
 ½ cup cold water ½ cup sugar
 4 eggs, separated ½ pint whipping cream
 ½ cup sugar
 Beat ½ cup sugar in egg yolks, lemon juice and rind, and butter. Cook in double boiler until thick. Stir in gelatin, which has been softened in the water, while the mixture is hot. Set aside to cool. Beat egg whites and add ½ cup sugar; then fold in whipped cream. Fold in cooled mixture and pour into a dish lined with 1 cup of crumbs; sprinkle remaining crumbs over top. Chill for at least 3 hours. Serves 8.

Brides Will Welcome Gifts By Home Seamstresses

Every bride welcomes dainty lingerie cases which she can use for the honeymoon and afterward.

Cases to hold lingerie, gloves, handkerchiefs, stockings and scarfs can make the difference between chaos and order in suitcases or bureau drawers. And every girl knows that nothing gives her such a feeling of ladylike well-being as fishing a dainty handkerchief from a scented satin-like case. Such cases are so simple to make that there's no excuse for any

woman not having enough of them. And they can solve all those problems of what to give at a bridal shower.

Local sewing center experts give a few tips on how to make them. They suggest using rayon taffeta for the outside of the cases, rayon satin for the lining and pelton for the interlining. An effective trimming is nylon galoon lace, available in 10-cent stores.

You can get standard patterns for sets of lingerie and handkerchief cases, which give detailed sewing instructions.

Tasty, Hearty Tuna Chowder Makes Fine Luncheon Dish

Home from school for lunch, boys and girls are likely to enjoy a nutritious and hearty potato-and-tuna chowder.

Grilled cheese sandwiches or toast spread with an egg salad mixture are good with the chowder. We find fresh fruit and crisp cookies a fine ending for this menu.

POTATO TUNA CHOWDER

Ingredients: 1 can (10½ ounces) frozen condensed cream of potato soup, 1½ to 1¾ cups milk, ¼ cup very finely diced celery, 1 can chunk style tuna (drained), finely grated carrot (for garnish).

Method: Place the unopened can of frozen soup in hot water for several minutes so soup can be removed easily. Turn into a medium-sized saucepan and add the milk and celery. Heat slowly, stirring occasionally, until soup is thawed. Bring to a boil, then turn heat

low again. Add drained tuna and stir well. Keep over low heat long enough to have tuna hot. Sprinkle servings of chowder with a little finely grated carrot. Makes 4 servings.

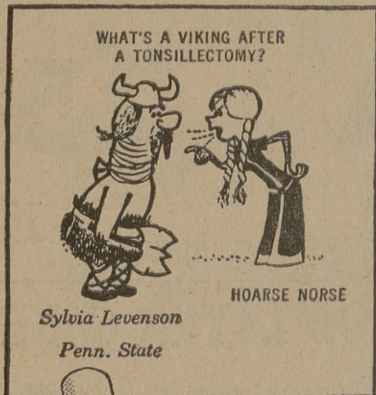

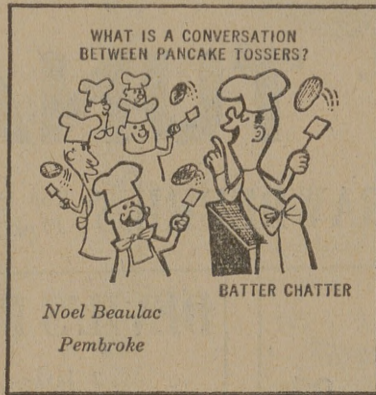

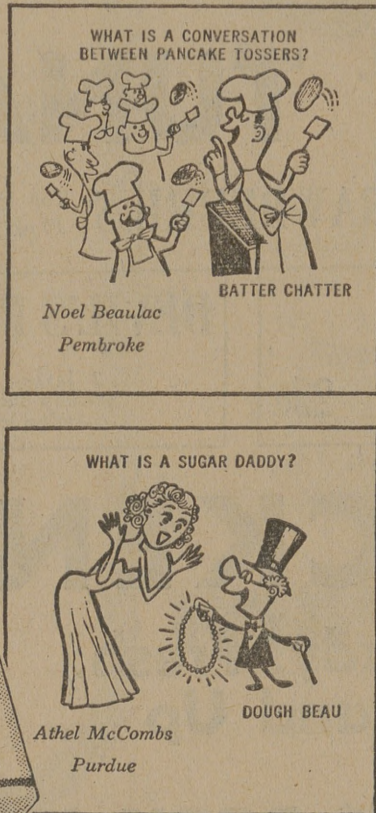
