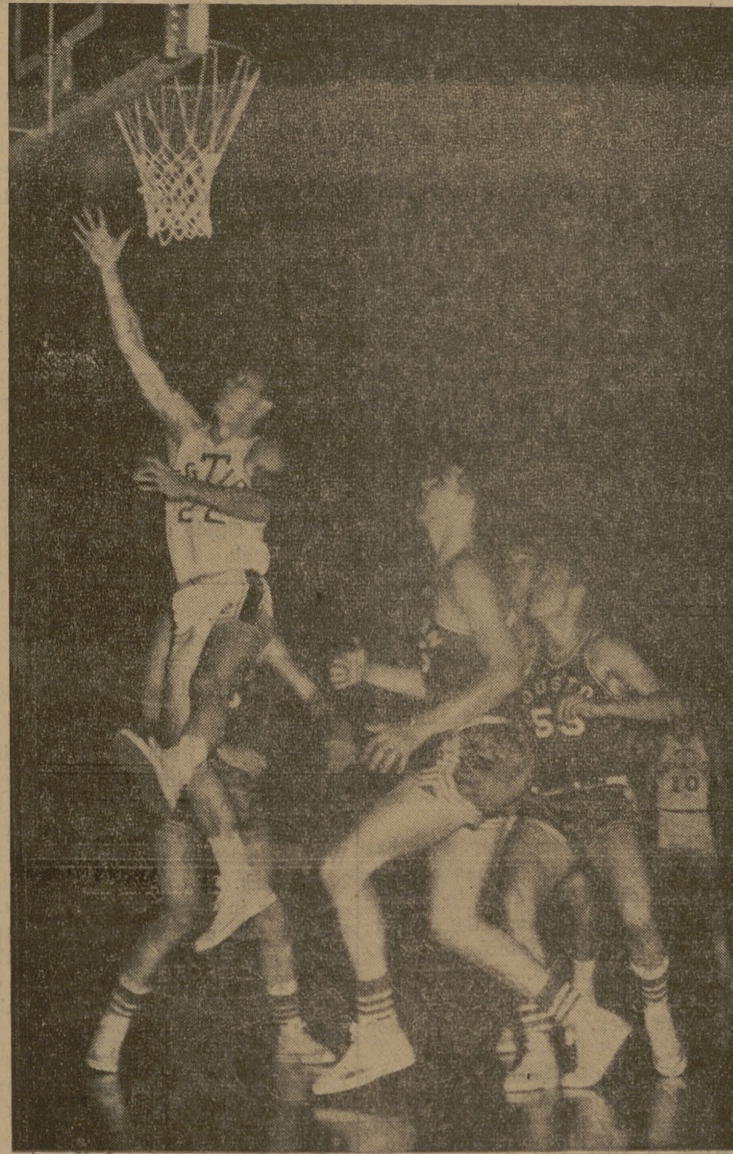


### Pistoleers Post Wins, Invite Newcomers

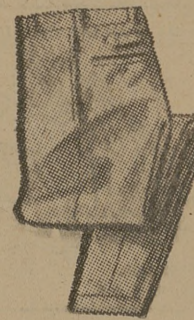

The visitors attended short courses, conferences, and other scheduled meetings.

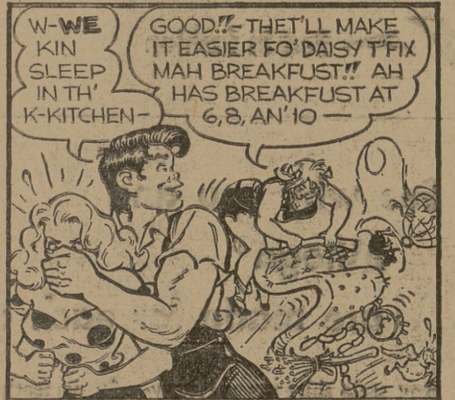
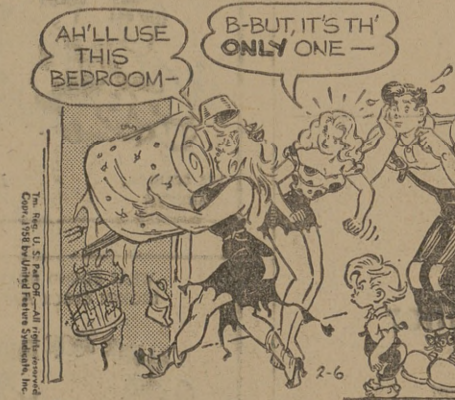

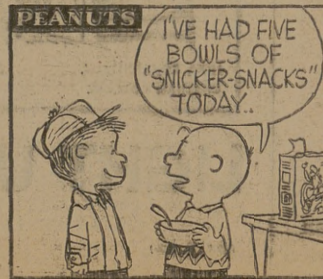
