building requests. Indications now are that it would receive high priority but the final decision depends on how vitally other campus improvements are needed. Dr. Harrington said the proposal will be studied each year until it is accepted.
So an armory at A&M could be built by one of two means. A bill giving federal aid for such buildings throughout the nation would make it almost a sure thing. If such a bill is never passed by Congress, A&M might rely on its own available funds and proceed with the building.


