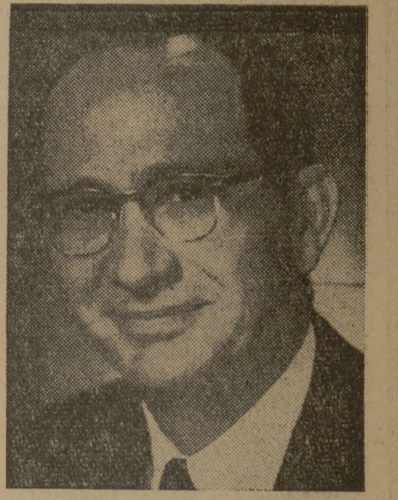

Writer and lecturer Milton Mayer will be in College Station Sunday and Monday for a series of addresses before local church groups.

Sunday afternoon at 5:30 a joint meeting of the Wesley Foundation and the Westminster Student Fellowship will hear him speak on "Science and Conscience" at the Wesley Foundation building. He will speak on "The American Spirit" at the 7 p.m. worship service of the A&M Methodist Church.

Monday evening at 7:15 topic for his address at the YMCA will be "Confessions of a Non-Anti-communist."

Mayer, an alumnus of the University of Chicago, has served as professor in adult education there and as visiting professor of religion at William Penn College.

He has also served as lecturer for the Fellowship of Reconciliation

and Jewish Peace Fellowship and as director of a nationwide leader training program for Great Books Foundation. He is now special representative for the Foundation.

Recently he returned from a year in Germany as professor of social research at Frankfurt University and from travel throughout Europe as director of the "Voices of Europe" radio programs.

In addition to articles appearing in Life, the Reader's Digest, Harper's Christian Century and the Catholic Digest, he is the author of "They Thought They Were Free: The Germans 1933-45."

SCIENTIST BLAMES SCIENTISTS

KENT, Ohio (AP)—A Kent State professor says scientists themselves are partly responsible for the small number of young people attracted to careers in science.
 Dr. Ralph W. Dexter, a biological researcher, says "in spite of the role that science plays in developing modern civilization, the public has little knowledge and little appreciation of science and scientists."
 He says scientists themselves could improve the situation "by giving more attention to social issues. A more sympathetic press and a more sympathetic public could do much to correct unfavorable impressions."
