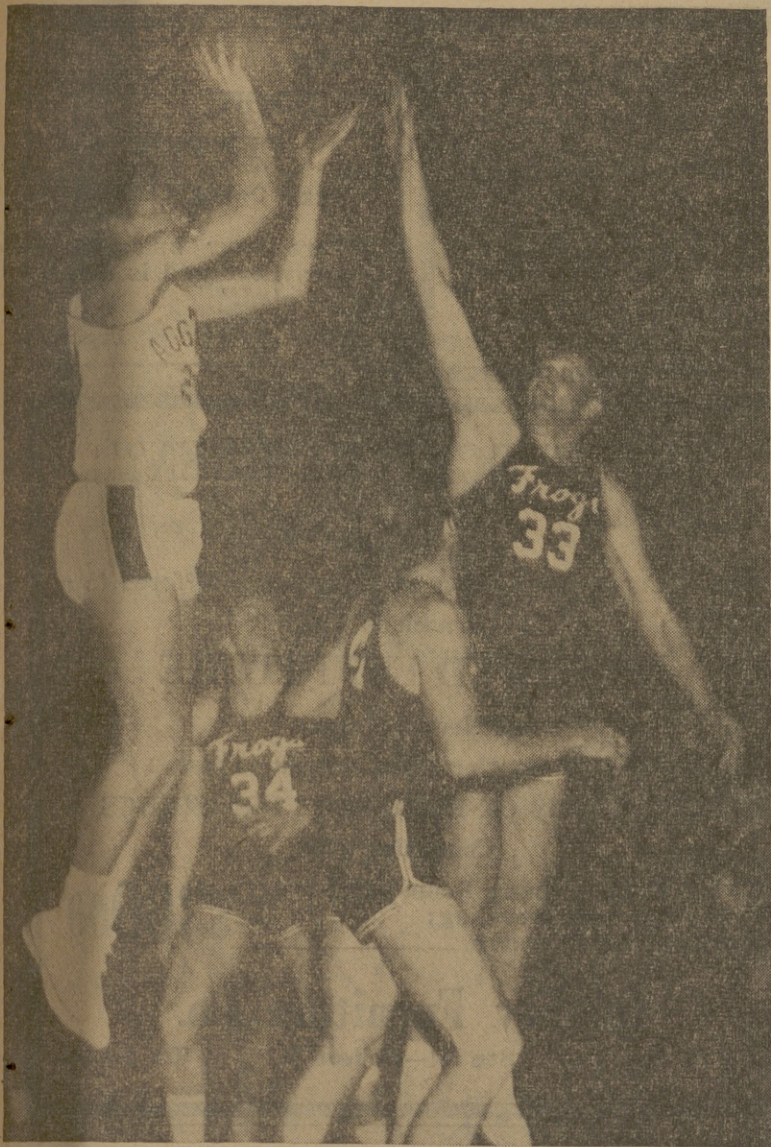


Tall Toads Silence Cadets, 62-42



Aggies Tie For Third With Rice; Fish Drop Prelim To Wogs, 83-68

The treetop-tall TCU Toads rang down—or tore down—the curtain on the most successful Aggie basketball season since 1951 last night, as they humbled the Cadets in the final appearance of the season on G. Rollie White Coliseum hardwoods, 62-42.
Breaking a tie for third place, the Froggies moved into a two-way tie for second slot with Texas Tech. The Raiders pummeled Rice in Lubbock and locked the Owls with A&M for third place.
In Waco, SMU beat Baylor 77-52 while Arkansas easily handled the Texas Longhorns in Fayetteville, 74-60 to share the conference crown. They will have a playoff

for the honors. This will be Southern Methodist's fourth consecutive snatching of the pennant.
The Horned Frogs, who possess one of the tallest squads in the conference, completely dominated court play. They hogged the rebounds, grabbing 44 to the Aggies 26. The Cadet shooting was worse than frigid at 28.8 per cent as compared with TCU's 41.8 per cent.
Dave Corson, 6-6 soph center from New Orleans was the only one able to break through the Froggies' defense, bucketing five of six field goal attempts for 10 points—the Aggie high scorer.
H. E. Kirchner, 6-10 center for the Frogs, was game high scorer with 19, but four Froggie team-

mates scored in double figures.
In the freshman preliminary game, Jerry Cobb of the Wogs fired 13 of 20 field goal attempts and sunk three free throws for a 29-point effort as he led the young Frogs past the Aggie Fish, 83-68. The Fish failed to win a conference contest.

With two men out in the tenth inning Sam Houston State's Tommy Leatherwood banged a single off Aggie Pitcher Toby Newton and scored a runner from third base to defeat the Cadets 3-2 yesterday afternoon in Huntsville.
Newton was the losing pitcher for the Farmers with Price being credited with the win for the Bearcats. The Aggies scored their runs in the seventh and eighth innings with the RBI's being credited to Co-Captain James Smotherman and Second Baseman Dink Patterson.
Bo Paradowski started on the mound for the Cadets, giving up one run, one hit and two walks in his three inning stint. Donnie Hullum took over the mound

chores next, giving up one run, two hits and two walks. Newton replaced Hullum in the seventh inning and pitched the remaining four. He gave up one run, one hit and walked seven.
The Aggies now have a 1-1 record for the season. Newton is credited with both the win and the loss. The Cadets face the Bearcats again Saturday for a return match in Kyle Field.
