UT Professor To Address Episcopal Men

Dr. Royal Embree Jr., University of Texas faculty member, will address the Episcopal Men of Brazos County at their next dinner meeting at 6:30 p.m. Tuesday in the refectory of St. Andrew's Church, Bryan.

His topic will be "The Layman's Responsibility in the Episcopal Church."

Dr. Embree is active in lay work in All Saints Church in Austin, where he is a vestryman and Sunday school teacher. At the University he is an associate professor of educational psychology, engaged in counselor training.
