The Farmers held a two-point lead going into the last event, the mile relay, but the Rice foursome were too fresh for the Cadets and easily took honors in the event to win the meet.

A&M victories were scored by Ernesto Uribe, who tallied 10 points; Herbert Carper in the high hurdles; C. J. Hajovsky in the 880-yard run; Fred Dulock in the two mile run; Smallwood in the low hurdles; Donald Douglas in the pole vault; Owen Hill in the discus and Henry Bonorden in the high jump.

Newton, Hullum Team In No-Hit Win Over TLC

Senior co-captain Toby Newton and Donnie Hullum, junior hurler from Baytown, combined efforts in a no-hit, no-run 6-0 victory over the Texas Lutheran College Bulldogs Saturday night to run the Aggie season mark to four wins in five outings.

Newton, a 6-0 lefthander from Galveston who was credited with the win, pitched six innings for A&M, striking out seven while walking eight and bringing his season record to 2-1. Hullum finished the contest, whiffing three and walking none.

The Aggie defense was superb, as the fielders made no miscues and racked up three double plays, bringing the season double play total to five—which incidentally equals the double play production of the 1957 team for the entire season.

Gary Herrington, stocky All-SWC catcher from Baytown, continued to rattle the walls with his hitting, as he slammed a home run,

a triple and a single in four trips to the plate. This raised his batting average to .643 with nine safeties in 14 times up.

In the third inning, Herrington blasted a long triple to left center field, but was left stranded on base.

In the sixth inning, J. B. Carroll singled and Herrington followed up with a 400-foot shot over the left-center field wall for two more runs.

In the seventh inning the Farmers attempted a double steal and tallied a run as the Bulldog catcher misfired on the throw to second base. Lloyd Stone tallied from third, but Wendell Reed was cut down on the throw from the plate.

The eighth inning found Coach Beau Bell's Cadets ripping off

three insurance runs as Houchin and Herrington singled. An attempted pickoff play by Texas Lutheran went amiss, allowing the runners to advance. James Smotherman lifted a fly to center field, scoring Houchin. Ed Dudley then boomed a long triple off the boards in left-center, scoring Herrington. Dudley scored from third on Stone's infield single to end the scoring.

The Aggies travel to Houston this afternoon to play the Houston Cougars in a return match. In the season opener, the Cadets blanked Houston, 4-0, for their only defeat of the season to this date.
