## Poland Blasts U.S. Policies

WARSAW (AP)—Communist Poland accused the United States and West Germany last night of up-setting chances of disarmament. It hinted the Poles will seek nuclear arms if such weapons are delivered to the West German armed forces.

"It is beyond question," said a Foreign Office statement, "that to arm the West German-Bundeswehr with nuclear weapons would create a new situation which would demand that Poland consider by what means its security could be strengthened."

## Handbook Tells Of Schooling Abroad

A new "Handbook on International Study," listing more than 25,000 scholarships for Americans wishing to study abroad and foreign students wanting to study in the United States, has recently been published by the Institute of International Education.

The 450-page book gives information such as a list of colleges and universities in 74 countries around the world, the names and services of organizations willing to help the "exchange" find living quarters and help in meeting new people where he is studying. Also given are tips on selecting a school abroad and an explanation of degree and credit requirements of both the United States and foreign educational systems.

The book costs \$3 and may be obtained from the Institute at 1 East 67th St. in New York City or from the regional offices in Chicago, Denver, San Francisco, Houston and Washington, D. C.

## Vanguard Moonlet Sighted Yesterday

CAMBRIDGE, Mass. (AP)—One of America's newest satellites, the 50-pound third-stage rocket which launched the moonlet, Vanguard I Monday, apparently was sighted yesterday for the first time, by Moonwatchers in New Mexico.

Moonwatch headquarters at the Smithsonian Astrophysical Observatory in Cambridge made the announcement. The scientists said the Moonwatch team at Alamogordo, N. M., looking skyward at 6:14 a. m. EST, at the approximate position predicted for the Vanguard satellite saw a faint object hustling eastward across the sky.

## Moon Trip Feasible Red Scientist Says

MOSCOW (AP)—A top Soviet scientist said yesterday one-way trips to the moon are perfectly feasible right now.

Getting back, he said, must await the establishment of manned refueling stations in space unless atomic energy can be used.

Scientist Nikolai Varvarov said chemical fuels now available could take a rocket to the moon and that flights to Mars and Venus could be figured out, too.

Varvarov is head of the astronomical section of the Soviet civil defense organization. He made his statements in an article in Soviet Fleet, the Soviet navy publication.

He estimated that, leaving the earth at 25,000 miles an hour, a rocket could get to the moon in 115 hours, just under five days.

## U.S. Summit Meet Plans Discarded

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Eisenhower administration has decided against holding a summit meeting in the United States.

It is considering Geneva in the fall as a likely place and time for such a conference.
