

Smallwood Enters Decathlon In Relays

Emmett Smallwood, who has been the mainstay of the 1958 track team, has been invited to participate in the decathlon competition at the Kansas Relays this weekend. The Aggies will bring a varsity track and field squad of 28 men, along with 24 freshmen to compete in the meet. Coach Ray Putnam has announced that Smallwood will enter the 100 and 220-yard dashes, the low hurdles, shot put, discus, javelin, broad jump and anchor the 440-yard relay. The senior specialty man hails from Galena Park. Lt. Robert Peake, B team football coach at the Air Force Academy in Denver, played four years of varsity football at Indiana University before being graduated in 1955.

Cadet Nine Chances Periled; Longhorns Appear Favorites

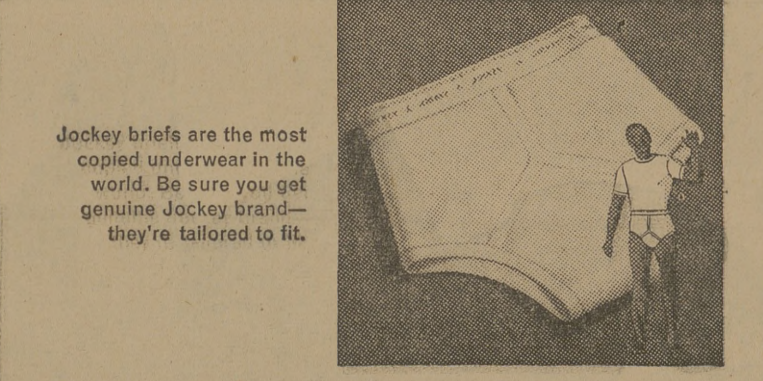
With Tuesday's loss to Rice, the Texas Aggies' chances of acquiring a portion of the Southwest Conference championship became very minute, indeed. Jerry Abernathy is about all Rice had to offer the Cadets, but it proved to be more than enough as the Houston hurler took command of A&M. He allowed but seven well-spaced hits, one of which was a double by catcher Gary Herrington. However, the picture might not be so dark as would be believed. The chances that the weaker teams in the conference can rise up for an unexpected victory came clear Tuesday as the TCU Frogs posted their first conference victory of the season—over hard-hitting Baylor. The Froggies pitching might have awakened, as for the first time this season, a TCU pitcher was able to go the route. As far as A&M is concerned, however, the big game was played in Austin yesterday. The Ponies were planning on using one of the conference's top hurlers in Carl Schlemeyer to try to stop the Texas hitting attack. The Pony pitcher has compiled a 3-1 pitching record this season and has an amazing .24 earned run mark. The Steers planned on using lefthander Bob Sudderth, formerly of Dallas Sunset to gain their sixth consecutive conference victory. Sudderth has a 4-1 record and a 2.60 e.r.a. Nevertheless, Texas is not so strong as to be called invincible. The Aggies will get their chance at stopping the Steers this Saturday on Kyle Field in their first game of the three game series. The top three hitters in the conference sport the orange and white of Texas University in George Myers (.500), Max Alvis (.476), and Woody Woodman (.450). Shortly behind the big three are Jerry Sims of Rice and A. C. Miller of Baylor, who bat a .400 and .364 respectively. Lloyd Stone is the Cadets' leading hitter with .352. Strangely enough, a pitcher is the runner-up from the hitting side of the picture, as Donnie Hullum sports a .300 average. Toby Newton is the "second winningest" pitcher in the conference behind George Myers of Texas. Myers has won 3 games and lost none, with an e.r.a. of 0.33. However, the Galveston hurler has yielded 4.50 runs per game in winning two and losing one. In team batting, Texas of course leads the parade with a hefty .306. Baylor is second with a poor .233 mark, followed by A&M's .220. From the statistics, it is evident that the conference is weak in hitting teams. Saturday's game could well decide the future for the Cadet nine. Game time is 2 p.m.
